II. REPORTS**A. EXECUTIVE BOARD**

The Board met on Tuesday, January 2, 2007, at 4:00 pm, at the Section XI Office. In attendance: President L. Lally, R. Goldin, W. Shierant, M.A. Jules, N. DeCillis, P. Nickerson, A. Van Cott, P. Ferenz, L. Schwartz, K. Seaman, L. Light, V. Cullen (item #4), D. Madison (items #1-5), J. Sexton and E. Cinelli. (Absent: C. Delargy, J. Finello)

1. President - Lisa Lally called the meeting to order at 4:09 pm.
2. Finance Committee – Finance Committee Chair Alan Van Cott reviewed the December 5, 2006 Finance Committee meeting report as well as the proposed 2007-08 budget. The Committee approved the 2007-08 budget, which contains an approximate 1.8% increase in Dues and Service Charges, and the appropriation of \$31,000 to the budget from the fund balance.
3. Treasurer's Report – Treasurer Larry Light provided an overview of the Section XI budget from July 1, 2006 through December 22, 2006.
4. 2005-06 Audit – The 2005-06 Audit and Management Letter was reviewed by Vinny Cullen from the accounting firm of Coughlin Foundotos Cullen & Danowski, LLP. Mr. Cullen stated that Section XI has implemented many financial policies and procedures that were recommended in the October 2005 Management Letter. Mr. Cullen also stated that Section XI has a substantial Fund Balance of undesignated net assets and may want to transfer funds to the designated assets for future building needs. Mr. Cullen also recommended that the Section continue the monitoring of financial policies and procedures including oversight of gate receipts, evaluating the controls and strengthening them when necessary. Mr. Cullen suggested that the Section might want to "spot check" procedures with respect to gate receipt collection.
5. Management Letter
 - The Executive Board requested that Treasurer Larry Light and Executive Director Ed Cinelli draft a response to the October 25, 2006 Management Letter provided by Coughlin Foundotos Cullen & Danowski, LLP. This response will be submitted to the Executive Board at its March 2007 meeting.
 - President Lisa Lally expressed a desire to increase the stipends of the Sports Chairs for the 2008-09 school year.
 - In a motion by Paula Nickerson, seconded by Mary Anne Jules, the Executive Board approved the transfer of \$100,000 from undesignated assets to designated assets for future building needs.
6. Executive Board Relocation Sub-Committee – Ross Goldin reviewed the report of the December 19, 2006 Executive Board Relocation Sub-Committee meeting. A timeline was developed at that meeting which states that if Section XI was to purchase a building, it should be done at the end of the lease which is May 31, 2009. Therefore, a building should be purchased no later than October, 2008. This timeline would allow for any necessary renovations in order to make the space usable. Executive Director Ed Cinelli will ask Pele Damianos of Damianos Realty for assistance in finding a property and will arrange for him to meet with the committee at a future date.
7. Counsel – Kevin Seaman
 - A. Mr. Seaman provided an overview of a memo from NYSPHSAA Executive Director Nina Van Erk and Legal Counsel Renee James regarding "Title IX Complaints Alleging Discrimination Against Female Athletes by Failing to Provide Equal Publicity and Promotional Services." Mr. Seaman stated that these complaints

- are not new or uncommon, and that the OCR guidelines require districts to provide equal treatment to male and female athletes in areas such as equipment, scheduling of events, locker rooms, cheerleading, promotional activities, etc. School districts should review their practices with respect to Title IX issues regularly.
- B. Mr. Seaman provided correspondence regarding a telephone conversation with Suffolk County Comptroller Joseph Sawicki.
 - C. Mr. Seaman reviewed a letter that he sent to Alicia Lord, an Investigator with the New York State Department of Labor. In that letter, Mr. Seaman explained the relationship of officials with Section XI as that of independent contractors and not employees. Ms. Lord had requested information regarding an official. The Section XI office cooperated with the investigation on October 26, 2006.
 - D. Mr. Seaman reviewed a letter that he sent to Deborah Marriott, attorney for the New York State Education Department's Office of School Personnel Review and Accountability. The letter requested that Section XI be granted computer access to OSPRA's fingerprint records. Mr. Seaman will follow up with Ms. Marriott regarding this request.
 - E. Mr. Seaman provided a decision by the Commissioner of Education regarding the classification of Seton Catholic Central High School for post-season competition. Seton Catholic Central High School is a non-public school located in Binghamton, and is a member of Section IV of the NYSPHSAA. Seton Catholic Central High School is appealing the Section IV decision to move up in classification. The appeal was dismissed.
 - F. Mr. Seaman reviewed a complaint by the parent of a Mt. Sinai student-athlete who was not given the opportunity to try out for the soccer team as she was away on vacation during the try-out period.
8. NYSPHSAA Reports – Paula Nickerson/Nick DeCillis
- A. Paula Nickerson reviewed the October 30, 2006 Executive Committee report. The one action item for Section input is the inclusion of selectively classified students in the NYSPHSAA transfer rule.
 - B. A motion by Pete Ferenz, seconded by Ross Goldin, to allow Ed Cinelli, Paula Nickerson and Nick DeCillis to attend the January 27 retirement celebration of NYSPHSAA Assistant Director Walter Eaton was approved.
 - C. Nick DeCillis and Paula Nickerson reviewed the November and December 2006 NYSPHSAA Office Reports.
9. President Lisa Lally
- A. Lisa Lally provided the Executive Board with the Internal Auditor's reports for October, November and December, 2006. The reports were reviewed by the Executive Board.
 - B. Lisa Lally and Ed Cinelli provided information regarding the NYSPHSAA Structure and Policy Review Committee. At the November 29, 2006 meeting, there was much discussion regarding voting procedures involved at the Section and State levels.
 - C. The Executive Board approved a three-year contract for Executive Director Ed Cinelli. Additionally, the Board approved the mileage reimbursement for Executive Director Ed Cinelli to travel to the upcoming NYSPHSAA meetings.
10. NYSPHSAA Hall of Fame Nominations – The Executive Director informed the Board that nominations have been received by the NYSPHSAA for Thad Mularz, Smithtown Administrator; and Mitch Kupchak, Brentwood Athlete.
11. Section XI Quarterly Expenses: Meals and Refreshments – The Executive Director provided the Executive Board with the meals and refreshments expenses for the period October 3, 2006 through January 1, 2007.

12. NYSPPHSAA Transportation Mileage Chart – The Executive Director reviewed the transportation mileage chart that is used by the NYPPHSAAA for the payment of officials. Discussion took place regarding the proposed use of this chart for reimbursement of Section XI sport chairs and committee members when they travel around the state. The Executive Board felt that reimbursement should only take place after mileage verification using Mapquest and toll reimbursement receipts are received. The Executive Director also provided the Executive Board with the revised IRS standard mileage rate for 2007, which is 48.5 cents per mile for business miles driven. This rate will be used within Section XI effective January 1, 2007.
13. Tax-Exempt Status – The Executive Director provided correspondence with the NYSPHSAA Treasurer Kathy Hagle regarding the Section's tax-exempt status.
14. NYSPPHSAA Budget and Finance Committee Meeting – The Executive Director reviewed the minutes of the October 29, 2006 meeting of the NYSPHSAA Budget and Finance Committee. The 2007-08 budget increase will be 4%. The dues increase for school districts will be \$50 per school district and 5 cents per student.
15. Female Representative Position – The Executive Director provided correspondence from NYSPHSAA Executive Director Nina Van Erk, informing the Section that Paula Nickerson's term of office as the Female Representative of Athletics ends as of August 31, 2007. Appropriate action will take place with respect to this opening.
16. Goals and Objectives – The Executive Director provided his 2006-07 Goals and Objectives Mid-Year Report.
17. Ramada Inn Damages – The Executive Director reviewed correspondence with Lauren Farrell, Director of Sales, at the Ramada Inn in Newburgh, New York. Apparently, there was approximately \$150 in damages occurring to room 253 while it was being occupied by the Section XI Boys' Cross Country team. The student-athletes involved in this incident have been notified by their schools and will be billed for the damages once the Section office receives the final costs relating to repairs.
18. Notice of Subsequent Arrests – The Executive Director provided the latest information regarding subsequent arrests of officials to the Executive Board.
19. Little Flower UFSD Membership Request – The Executive Director provided correspondence with George Grigg, Superintendent of the Little Flower Union Free School District, regarding membership. Little Flower is interested in becoming a member of Section XI.
20. Amityville Correspondence – The Executive Director provided correspondence with Amityville Superintendent Dr. Brian De Sorbe, regarding racial slurs used during a football contest that involved Amityville. Dr. De Sorbe requested that the Section establish a protocol for all officials to use whenever racial slurs and other types of verbal harassment are reported during an athletic contest. He recommends that the reporting of such incidents must involve coaches and/or other staff members that are at the event. Ed Cinelli will follow up with the President of the Officials' Associations regarding the establishment of such protocols.
21. Golf Championship – The Executive Director provided correspondence regarding an incident at a golf tournament between two member schools. The Director has requested that Boys' Golf Chair Drew Walker review the misconduct regulations with coaches at the next Mandatory Coaches' Meeting.

22. USA Today Article – The Executive Director provided an article from USA Today regarding transfer regulations in various states.
 23. NCAA Amateurism Certification Newsletter – The Executive Director provided copies of this newsletter which indicates registration procedures for the NCAA Clearinghouse.
 24. Shoreham-WR Wrestler Corey Jantzen – The Executive Director provided information to the Executive Board regarding Shoreham-Wading River wrestler Corey Jantzen. Corey participated in a wrestling tournament in Evanston, Illinois, in late December, 2006, and participated in matches against college students. According to the NYSPHSAA Handbook, Bylaws and Eligibility Standards, 7. College: *“A student is no longer eligible to represent that school in that sport in that season if the student participates in practice or competition with or against any college athletic squad during that season.”* Shoreham-Wading River Athletic Director James Cranmer, and NYSPHSAA Executive Director Nina Van Erk, are aware of this situation. Corey Jantzen is ineligible to participate in wrestling for the remainder of the 2006-07 school year.
- B. NYSPHSAA EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE – N. DeCillis, P. Nickerson
At its October 30, 2006 meeting, the NYSPHSAA Executive Committee effected the following:
1. Boys and Girls Basketball - Approved the NYSPHSAA Boys/Girls Basketball State Championships be scheduled for March 14-16, 2008, and the Federated Tournament of Champions will be scheduled March 28 and 29, 2008.
 2. Girls Lacrosse
 - Approved the appointment of Liz Parry as Assistant Girls Lacrosse Coordinator effective immediately through August 31, 2010.
 - Approved a waiver in Girls Lacrosse for the 2007 season to permit the wearing of uniforms that do not meet the new numbering requirement.
 3. Wrestling
 - Approved a 22-point system per individual in Wrestling for the 2007-2008 season.
 - Approved allowing multiple entries in tournaments in Wrestling.
 - Approved a waiver of Wrestling Rules 6-64a-1 and 6-65a-1 regarding correction of errors during a match for the 2006-2007 season only.
 - Approved the use of the NFHS Wrestling Communicable Skin Disease form effective the 2006-2007 season.
 - Approved wrestlers with braces on their teeth must wear a mouth guard which covers all of the braces.
 4. Boys and Girls Cross Country - Approved the variation in classification numbers in Boys/Girls Cross Country effective 2007-2008 and 2008-2009.
 5. Girls Basketball - Approved the realignment of the Class B Regional brackets in Girls Basketball effective 2006-2007.
 6. Boys Basketball - Approved the selection of officials for Boys Basketball Regional contests will continue to be from neutral Sections for 2006-2007.
 7. Girls Volleyball - Approved an extension for proposing a variation in classification for 2007-2008 in Girls Volleyball.

8. Transfers

- Approved the new Transfer Rule language regarding residency effective immediately with the winter and spring 2006-2007 season: *"Students who **transfer** from any school to the public school district of their residence **or a private school within that district's boundaries**, shall be exempt from the Transfer Rule. Such a transfer without penalty will only be permitted once in a high school career."*
- Approved to add #6-Exemptions to the Transfer Regulation for students of military employees.

9. Ticket Prices

- Approved to reduce the full tournament ticket price by \$1 per session when approved by the Executive Director for multi-session tournaments. Such tickets are non-refundable.
- Approved a one-year experiment to offer a \$1 reduction for tournament tickets, presale and non-refundable, for groups of 20 or more at the Girls Volleyball State Championships.

10. Membership Dues - Approved to increase the membership dues for the 2007-2008 school year. There will be a 4% increase in the NYSPHSAA dues for 2007-2008. The per district charge will increase by \$50 (from \$700 to \$750). In addition, there will be a 5 cent increase (from 75 cents to 80 cents) per student grades 7-12 for enrollments over 300 students.

11. Discussion Items – January Meeting

- Inclusion of Selectively Classified students in the Transfer Rule.

C. NYSPHSAA JANUARY OFFICE REPORT – Lisa Lally

1. President Lally reviewed the NYSPHSAA Office Report and highlighted the Structure and Policy Review Committee. She mentioned that the next meeting will be January 31, 2007. President Lally and Executive Director Ed Cinelli will continue to provide information regarding this committee at Athletic Director and Conference meetings.
2. President Lally announced that the NYSPHSAA Concussion Management Workshop will be scheduled for this spring in Section XI.

D. COUNSEL – Kevin Seaman

1. Mr. Seaman reviewed the Title IX complaint alleging discrimination against female athletes. He stated that these complaints are not new and that school districts should check their equivalencies in all matters relating to boys' and girls' interscholastic athletics. Mr. Seaman reviewed a document from the OCR which states that districts should check the number of opportunities that districts provide for both boys and girls. Also, the OCR, if they conduct an investigation, would look at an assortment of items involved in the athletic program. Schools should be proactive with respect to assuring that boys' and girls' athletic programs are equally provided for.
2. Mr. Seaman provided information regarding a telephone conversation with Suffolk County Comptroller Joseph Sawicki.
3. Mr. Seaman reviewed a letter that he sent to an investigator from the New York State Department of Labor with respect to the relationship of officials with Section XI as that of independent contractors and not employees.
4. Mr. Seaman reviewed a letter that he sent to Deborah Marriott, attorney for the New York State Education Department's Office of School Personnel Review and Accountability, requesting that Section XI be granted computer access to OSPRA's fingerprint records.

3. SeedingMotion: T. CombsSecond: R. Mayo

"Shall the Seeding Team Tournaments, Guideline #9 be amended as follows:"

*The Seeding Committee SHALL consider a team from a mixed classification league/division when said team has not qualified for the Section tournament provided **detailed written** documentation indicates said team is one of the strongest in its classification.*

Athletic Directors of teams in mixed classification leagues/divisions should inform coaches of this procedure and should also advise their coaches to schedule non-league contests with other strong teams within their respective classifications to enhance their season records.
