



**II. REPORTS****A. EXECUTIVE BOARD**

The Board met on Monday, October 1, 2007, at 4:00 pm, at the Section XI Office. In attendance: President L. Lally, R. Goldin, C. Delargy, W. Shierant, M.A. Jules, N. DeCillis, P. Nickerson, A. Van Cott, P. Ferenz, K. Seaman, L. Light, H. Maloney (Items 1-2), D. Lunetta (Items 1-3), D. Madison (Items 1-4), J. Sexton and E. Cinelli. (Absent: J. Finello, L. Schwartz).

1. President - Lisa Lally called the meeting to order at 4:14 pm.
2. Internal Claims Auditor Helen Maloney
  - A. Ms. Maloney reported to the Executive Board, complimenting Donna Madison and Donna Nebgen on their cooperation and compliance with all of her requests.
  - B. Ms. Maloney made a recommendation to the Executive Board that the Treasurer of the Association should sign all checks issued by the Section.
  - C. Discussion took place with respect to procedures that Section XI utilizes in approving payments and signing checks. Executive Director Ed Cinelli reviewed the current procedure where three individuals in the Section XI office sign off on each invoice and/or officials claim form submitted for payment. In addition, final approval must be given by the Internal Claims Auditor prior to a check being released. Currently, all checks are signed by the Executive Director.
  - D. The Executive Board formed a sub-committee to develop a policy regarding check signing procedures. The Committee consisting of Chairman Larry Light, Pete Ferenz, Charlie Delargy and Donna Madison.
3. Coughlin Foundotos Cullen & Danowski, LLP – Deirdre Lunetta

Deirdre Lunetta from the accounting firm of Coughlin Foundotos Cullen & Danowski, LLP, reviewed the draft of the September 26, 2007 Management Letter. Discussion took place with respect to:

  - Preparation of annual financial statements
  - Net assets
  - Gate receipts
  - Meal money
  - Allocation of expenses
  - Revenue classification
  - QuickBooks computer controls

A lengthy discussion took place with respect to meal money that is provided to student-athletes and supervisors who qualify for state championships. Ms. Lunetta expressed a concern that "professional skepticism" exists due to the signatures verifying distribution of cash.

4. Treasurer – Larry Light

Mr. Light reviewed the Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual report for the period July 1, 2007 through September 27, 2007, and provided a two-year budget comparison to the Executive Board. He noted that there was a \$31,100 allocation from the fund balance to the balance the 2007-08 budget. Mr. Light stated that the Section must decide what to do with the fund balance. A possibility would be to reduce the Dues and Service Charges to the member districts in future budgets.
5. Appointments

The Executive Board approved the following:

  - Sport Chairs for the 2007-08 school year.  
Note: President Lisa Lally recommended to the Executive Board that sport

chair stipends and supervision fees be reviewed. A sub-committee consisting of Chairperson Lisa Lally, Paula Nickerson, Wayne Shierant and Pete Ferenz will meet to provide recommendations to this end.

- Committee Chairs for the 2007-08 school year.
- Conference attendance authorization for the 2007-08 school year.

#### 6. Finances

- A. The Executive Board approved the following:
  - Contractual items
  - Leasing/service agreement continuations
  - Declaration of identified equipment as obsolete
  - Revision of credit card policy to redefine the spending limit of \$5,000 per purchase with a credit line not to exceed \$10,000.
- B. The Executive Director provided the Section XI Meal and Refreshment Quarterly Report for the period between May 14, 2007 and September 28, 2007.
- C. The Executive Director provided a report of Section XI Petty Cash Fund expenditures for the period between October 3, 2006 and September 28, 2007.

#### 7. NYSPPHSAA

- A. Paula Nickerson, Nick DeCillis, Pete Ferenz and Alan Van Cott provided information regarding the August 7-9, 2007 NYSPPHSAA Central Committee meeting.
- B. A discussion took place with respect to the NYSPPHSAA request to be registered in New York State as a "charity".
- C. Executive Director Ed Cinelli provided information regarding the NYSPPHSAA Transfer Rule and Appeal Guidelines that have been established.
- D. The Executive Director reviewed the NYSPPHSAA Office Reports for June 2007 and September 2007.
- E. The Executive Director gave an overview of the September 25, 2007 meeting of the NYSPPHSAA Structure and Policy Review Committee. He highlighted the major topics at the meeting which were non-public schools, governance, the transfer rule and sports seasons. Recommendations from the Committee will be discussed at the October 29, 2007 NYSPPHSAA Executive Committee meeting in Albany.
- F. NYSPPHSAA Executive Director Nina Van Erk has requested that each Section be given the opportunity to submit a candidate to the NYSPPHSAA Handbook Committee.
- G. The Executive Director provided an overview of the NYSPPHSAA Mandatory Eligibility Workshop that was held in Section XI on September 19, 2007. He reported that the feeling of many athletic directors was that the workshop was effective and informative. All Section XI member schools were represented with the exception of one athletic director, who had a previous commitment. This athletic director will be attending the Section VIII workshop on October 10.
- H. The Executive Director reviewed with the Executive Board NYSPPHSAA Regulation #18 regarding Outside Agencies, and the procedures that are needed for a school to use colleges, universities and other organizations for contests. A follow-up regarding this regulation will take place in January.
- I. The Executive Director provided a copy of a form that was sent to NYSPPHSAA Executive Director Nina Van Erk listing Lisa Lally and Ed Cinelli as the Section XI officers who are eligible to serve as proxies for the 2007-08 school year.
- J. The Executive Director provided information that was reviewed at the NYSPPHSAA August meeting regarding interstate contest sanctioning procedures. Section XI member schools are urged to contact NYSPPHSAA staff member Barb Hennessey

(phone 518-690-0771; e-mail [bhennessy@nysphsaa.org](mailto:bhennessy@nysphsaa.org)) regarding all initial communications relating to sanctioning.

- K. The Executive Director provided the 2007-08 NYSPHSAA Championship Dates and Sites.
8. Counsel – Kevin Seaman
    - A. Mr. Seaman reviewed a potential litigation regarding an eligibility question from a member school. The school failed to provide a waiver of the transfer rule in a timely manner for a student-athlete to participate in the first contest of the season.
    - B. Mr. Seaman announced that the Executive Director and he will attend an upcoming Long Island School Board meeting in December to provide school board members with information regarding Section XI.
    - C. Mr. Seaman provided information regarding the Tennessee Secondary School Athletic Association v. Brentwood Academy US Supreme Court ruling. This decision has held the TSAAA's enforcement of its anti-recruitment rule against Brentwood Academy, a private school member, does not violate Brentwood's First Amendment free speech rights.
    - D. Mr. Seaman reviewed information on student-athlete drug testing procedures approved by various states.
  9. Officials Negotiations – Nick DeCillis provided information on the September 17, 2007, meeting of the Section XI Officials Negotiations Committee with members of the Suffolk County Officials Presidents Council. A second meeting is scheduled for October 3, 2007.
  10. Goals and Objectives – The Executive Director presented his Goals and Objectives for the 2007-08 school year.
  11. Purchasing vs. Renting Office Space – The Executive Director provided information regarding the pros and cons of purchasing and renting office space for Section XI housing needs. This item will be discussed with the Finance Committee. A recommendation will be made to the Finance Committee that the Section continue its leasing arrangement with Damianos Realty at its present location.
  12. NYSPHSAA Hall of Fame Nominations – The Executive Director provided information regarding the NYSPHSAA Hall of Fame. The Executive Board approved the recommendation of the Executive Director to endorse possible candidates Jack Foley, Three Village Administrator; Boomer Esiason, East Islip Athlete; and Sal Ciampi, Sr, East Islip Coach.
  13. Notice of Subsequent Arrests – The Executive Director provided a listing of the current status of the subsequent arrests of officials.
  14. OSPRA – The Executive Director provided information regarding the status of Section XI's authorization for access into the SED's Office of Teaching Initiatives TEACH computer system. Access to this system will allow Section XI to properly maintain fingerprint records on approximately 1,400 officials. Efforts to gain access have not been successful to date; however, user names and passwords have been issued to selected Section XI staff members.
  15. Mixed Competition – The Executive Director provided reports of the Mixed Competition Committee from their August 28, 2007, meeting. At that meeting, the Committee denied two male students from participating on sport teams organized for

females. The Executive Director also announced that Horseheads High School in Section IV has a male student-athlete participating on a girls' volleyball team. It was also reported that this athlete has had a significant effect on the participation of the female student-athletes in that sport.

- B. NYSPHSAA CENTRAL COMMITTEE – N. DeCillis, P. Nickerson, P. Ferenz, A. Van Cott  
At its annual meeting of August 7-9, 2007, at the Crowne Plaza, Lake Placid, the NYSPHSAA Central Committee effected the following:

1. Sport Seasons - Approved the 2007-2008 Section Sports Seasons.
2. Boys' Golf - Approved the reappointment of Doug Courtright as Boys' Golf State Coordinator for a 5-year term effective September 1, 2007.
3. Boys' Tennis – Approved the appointment of Selina DeCicco as Boys' Tennis State Coordinator effective September 1, 2007 through August 31, 2011.
4. Financial and Pension Manager Appointment – Approved the appointment of A.J. Amato Wealth Management as the Association's Financial and Pension Manager.  
Note: **Registered Charity**
  - NYSPHSAA has filed to be a New York State registered charity which will allow the NYSPHSAA to continue to pursue NYS grants. This also carries with it a need for increased financial controls as the NYS Attorney General's office will have access to NYSPHSAA records and procedures to support those grants.
5. Structure and Policy Review Committee – Approved a timeline for areas of concern to be determined, reviewed and implemented as a result of the Structure and Policy Review Committee's survey.
  - August: Determine 3 or 4 areas of concern from prioritized information received from Sections. Establish a committee to review these concerns to determine which ones should be implemented. Each recommended area of concern should be rewritten so that the intention and language are clear. The committee will report back at the October meeting.
  - October: Receive and discuss the committee's report. Take areas of concerns recommended for implementation back to the Sections for discussion and review.
  - January: Approve areas of concern that will be implemented. Establish implementation committee to determine specific language for each approved area of concern and the process and timeline of adding these areas to our Constitution/Bylaws or Policy Manual. The Committee will report back at the May meeting.
  - May: Review and discuss the committee's recommendations and take them back to the Sections for review and discussion.
  - August: Final vote on implementation of committee's recommendations.
6. Friends and Neighbors - Approved as Friends and Neighbors: Rye Country Day School (1), Holy Family Catholic School (6).
7. New Member – Approved as a New Member: Buffalo Academy of Science Charter School (6).
8. Budget Adjustment - Approved an adjustment of a 5.4% increase to the 2007-08 budget to accommodate the full time position of Treasurer.

9. Bowling - Approved language clarification in the sport of Bowling. **GAME:** A game consists of 10 frames. **MATCH (contest):** Consists of a maximum of 3 games. **TOURNAMENT:** Consists of a maximum of 6 games. The Baker format may be used a maximum of two times per season with a maximum of 15 Baker format games per tournament. A combination tournament is permitted with a maximum of eight (8) Baker format games and three (3) games. A combination tournament counts towards the maximum of two (2) Baker format tournaments. **INDIVIDUAL LIMITATIONS:** A student may not participate in more than one contest per day. **TIE BREAKING PROCEDURES:** In tournament competition only one of the following tie breaking procedures may be used until the tie is broken: 1. regular game; 2. 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup> frame roll off; 3. one game Baker format. The tie breaking procedure must be designated prior to the start of the tournament.
10. NFHS Wrestling Skin Disease Form – Approved the revised NFHS Wrestling Skin Disease Form adopted this spring by the NFHS. The physician is to now write in the number of lesions along with their locations and mark location and number on the body forms. In ART. 3, the phrase “as defined by the NFHS or the state associations” has been added. The Minimum Treatment statements for “Bacterial Diseases” and “Herpetic Lesions” have been revised.
11. Sportsmanship Rule - Approved additional language in the Sportsmanship Rule, pg. 72, a. COACH, #1 of the NYSPHSAA Handbook. ...The coach may not be present at the game site *nor communicate in any manner during the contest with any person present at the site.*
12. Amateur Rule - Approved to raise the monetary value of awards or prizes from \$100 to \$250 in the Amateur Rule, pg. 56, a., 2. NOTE of the NYSPHSAA Handbook. “Only awards or prizes having a monetary value of *two hundred fifty dollars* or less per competition will be approved by the Association.”
13. Interschool Scrimmage/Practice Sessions - Approved additional language to Interschool Scrimmage/Practice Sessions, pg. 64, #12 of the NYSPHSAA Handbook. 12 INTERSCHOOL SCRIMMAGE/PRACTICE SESSIONS *“the use of officials would be permitted and encouraged whenever possible for the purpose of instruction regarding the rules and proper application of rules.”*
14. Transfer Rule
  - Approved to add as a NOTE to #30-TRANSFER, pg. 74 of the NYSPHSAA Handbook that the Transfer Rule as written will be enforced with no variations permitted.
  - Approved the Transfer Appeal Guidelines for the NYSPHSAA Transfer Rule developed by the Section Executive Directors.

#### **DISCUSSION ITEM**

The Life of an Athlete Committee is requesting a handbook revision to change the NYSPHSAA Chemical Health Mandate to read as follows: *“Each Section must hold at least one of the Life of an Athlete Program Workshops during the school year and attended by representation from each school in their Section. The chemical health workshops were mandated in 1990-91. Failure to meet the mandate will result in exclusion from sectionals the following school year.”* It was requested that this be taken back to the Sections for input and discussion. It will also be put on the agenda for the October NYSPHSAA Handbook Committee meeting.

## C. NYSPHSAA Structure and Policy Committee – Ed Cinelli

1. Executive Director Ed Cinelli gave a synopsis of the September 25, 2007 meeting of the NYSPHSAA Structure and Policy Committee meeting held at the NYSPHSAA office. The Committee identified the following areas to be brought to the October state Executive Committee meeting for action:
  - ~ Non Public Schools
  - ~ Governance
  - ~ Transfer Rule
  - ~ Sport Season

D. NYSPHSAA – Assistant Director, Bob Stulmaker

Mr. Stulmaker reported on the following:

1. Boys and Girls Basketball – The boys and girls basketball federation tournament dates have been moved to Friday, March 28; Saturday, March 29, and Sunday, March 30.
2. Boys Lacrosse – The East semi-final championship game will be held at West Point, not Stony Brook as originally planned.
3. Mandatory Athletic Director Workshop – Mr. Stulmaker gave a review of the Mandatory Athletic Director workshops that have been conducted in each Section. The feedback has been excellent, and plans will take place for these meetings each year.
4. Boys Basketball – Boys basketball uniforms must be white in color, rather than gray or off-white as is sometimes used.
5. Safety Equipment – Mr. Stulmaker reminded everyone that all safety equipment required for competitions must also be worn during practices. Examples would include head gear, eye guards, goalie equipment, etc.
6. Wrestling Clinic – The wrestling clinic is scheduled for November 2 at Cornell.
7. NYSPHSAA Status – Mr. Stulmaker mentioned that the NYSPHSAA has approved being considered a charity. This designation will increase financial accountability.

- e. If possible, a physician or his/her designee will be assigned to the Section XI wrestling leagues.
- f. Officials will be assigned to conduct skin checks during the weigh-in prior to the start of each tournament.
