**B. Scholar-Athlete Teams** – The listing of Section XI Scholar-Athlete Teams for the Fall 2008 sports season was distributed to the Athletic Council (Attachment A).

**II. REPORTS****A. EXECUTIVE BOARD**

The Executive Board met on Monday, January 5, 2009, at 4:00 pm, at the Section XI Office. In attendance: President R. Goldin, C. Delargy, M.A. Jules, L. Lally, N. DeCillis, P. Nickerson, P. Ferenz, A. Annunziato, P. Sullivan-Kriss, K. Seaman, L. Light, A. Groveman, J. Sexton and E. Cinelli. (Absent: L. Schwartz).

1. President – Ross Goldin called the meeting to order at 4:08 pm.
2. Treasurer's Report – Larry Light  
Mr. Light reviewed the Section XI Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual report for the period July 1, 2008 through December 29, 2008, and provided an explanation to the Executive Board regarding the income that has been received by the Section and the expenses that have been incurred by the Section for this period of time.
3. Counsel – Kevin Seaman
  - A. Mr. Seaman reviewed a Freedom of Information request dated November 17, 2008, from an attorney with respect to injuries that were sustained at an October 7, 2008 varsity girls' soccer contest. Mr. Seaman reviewed with the Executive Board that Section XI, as a "not-for-profit" corporation, is not subject to the Freedom of Information laws; and, therefore, did not provide the requested information.
  - B. Mr. Seaman reviewed with the Executive Board the Appeal Hearing that was conducted on November 25, 2008, regarding a Sayville High School student-athlete. The hearing panel overturned the November 14, 2008 decision of the Section XI Eligibility Committee thereby deeming the student-athlete eligible to participate in basketball during the 2008-09 school year.
4. Finance Committee – Alan Groveman
  - A. The Section XI Finance Committee Chair, Alan Groveman, reviewed the December 2, 2008 Finance Committee meeting report, including the proposed 2009-10 budget. The Finance Committee approved the 2009-10 budget, which contains no increase in Dues and Service Charges, along with the appropriation of \$257,650 to the budget from the fund balance.
  - B. Mr. Groveman commented that the 2007-08 audit and management letter by Coughlin Foundotos Cullen & Danowski, LLP did not identify financial items that Section XI needs to address during the current school year. The Section, however, must continue to closely monitor gate receipts and meal money due to the cash involved.
5. OMNI 403(b) Compliance – Ed Cinelli
  - A. The Executive Board updated the Executive Board on the procedures that have been put in place with respect to the development of a 403(b) Written Plan Document by The Omni Group.
  - B. The Executive Director reviewed a letter dated December 18, 2008, received from The Omni Group along with the 403(b) Written Plan Document prepared for Section XI. After review of this document by the Executive Director and Deirdre Lunetta of Coughlin Foundotos Cullen & Danowski, LLP, it was determined that a number of corrections need to be made. The Executive Director will follow up with The Omni Group regarding this document. When the Section receives the final Written Plan Document, it will be placed on the Executive Board agenda for approval.

6. NYSPPSHAA – Nick DeCillis, Paula Nickerson
  - A. Paula Nickerson and Nick DeCillis provided information regarding the October 2008 NYSPHSAA Executive Committee meeting held in Albany.
  - B. Nick DeCillis informed the Executive Board that the NYSPHSAA Executive Committee defeated the NYSPHSAA Budget and Finance Committee's recommendations of a dues increase.
  - C. Additionally, the state approved the establishment of an ad hoc committee to look at financial concerns.
7. NYSPHSAA Fiscal Concerns Committee Report – Ed Cinelli  
The Executive Director provided information regarding the NYSPHSAA Fiscal Concerns Committee's recommendations. The Executive Director reviewed each of the 13 items with the Executive Board. These items will be discussed further at the Section XI Conference and Athletic Council meetings. Input has been sought from all Section XI Athletic Directors regarding financial areas the Section should consider to assist districts in the budget process.
8. NYSPHSAA Sports Season Committee – Lisa Lally  
Lisa Lally provided information to the Executive Board regarding the NYSPHSAA Sports Season survey. This survey was conducted with the hope of getting input from all Superintendents, Principals and Athletic Directors regarding sports placement as well as asking questions with respect to the establishment of cheerleading as a sport. Ms. Lally stated that the NYSPHSAA will be conducting a state participation survey in March 2009 that would help to determine current sports placement in the various Sections that will guide the Sports Season Committee to properly develop future recommendations.
9. President – Ross Goldin  
President Goldin provided the Executive Board with the Internal Auditor's reports for September, October and November, 2008.
10. Tax Exempt Status – The Executive Director provided correspondence regarding the tax exempt status that the Section has in conjunction with the NYSPHSAA. Over the past few years, there have been questions raised by the NYSPHSAA Treasurer regarding this arrangement. The Section XI Executive Board has determined that it will seek its own tax exempt status.
11. NYSPHSAA Hall of Fame – Nick DeCillis provided information for the Executive Board regarding the nomination of Sue Wicks, former Center Moriches girls' basketball student-athlete. The Board endorsed this nomination.
12. Section XI Quarterly Expenses – The Executive Director provided the Executive Board with the Meals and Refreshment expenses for the period October 2, 2008 through January 2, 2009.
13. Outside Agency Approval – The Executive Board approved the following outside agencies to conduct tournaments within Section XI:
  - Eastern Long Island Basketball Officials Association, December 27-28, 2008
  - Western Suffolk Basketball Officials Association, December 5-6, 2008

The Executive Board approved a minimum of \$1 million each occurrence and \$3 million aggregate in insurance coverage that must be provided by any outside agencies who wish to conduct athletic events in Section XI.

14. Executive Director Goals and Objectives – The Executive Director provided his 2008-09 Goals and Objectives Mid-Year Report to the Executive Board.
15. Life of an Athlete – The Executive Director reviewed the Life of an Athlete workshop that took place on December 4, 2008 at the Inn at East Wind in Wading River. All Section XI schools participated in this workshop.
16. Early Edition Media, Inc. – The Executive Director provided correspondence from Jason Molinet, President of Early Edition Media, Inc., in Huntington. Mr. Molinet is planning to publish a magazine on Long Island athletics and is requesting approval to take photographs at contests that would sell via the internet. The Executive Board is not in favor of any individuals or groups taking photographs of student-athletes and placing them on the web for sale. The Executive Director will review this with Mr. Molinet.

**B. NYSPHSAA EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE** – N. DeCillis, P. Nickerson

At its October 2008 meeting, the NYSPHSAA Executive Committee effected the following:

1. Sport Coordinators – Approved Marsha Horan as Assistant Girls' Indoor Track and Field Coordinator through August 31, 2013; and Peter Szymanski as Assistant Boys' Indoor Track and Field Coordinator through August 31, 2009.
2. Girls' Basketball
  - Approved a waiver until 2011 of the requirement of the home team to wear a light colored uniform in girls' basketball.
  - Approved a waiver on the requirement for officials to request a physician's note when an athlete wears a "sleeve" on the arms or legs in girls' basketball.
3. Cross Country – Approved a waiver of the NYSPHSAA Jewelry Rule to allow the wearing of a wrist watch in boys' and girls' cross country effective immediately.
4. Thunder and Lightning Rule – Approved removing the word *approximately* in the Thunder and Lightning Rule.
5. Good Sports Program – Approved a motion to change the name of the Good Sports Program to the Sportsmanship Promotion Program.
6. Handbook Committee
  - Approved the Handbook Committee's recommendation to remove the last paragraph of the Senior All-Star Contest eligibility standard.
  - Approved the Handbook Committee's recommendation for schools that have made arrangements with another member school to share the use of a practice facility may do so without violating the Scrimmage Regulation as long as the athletes/team do not scrimmage before the required number of practices has been completed.
7. Moratorium
  - Approved tabling a motion to impose a moratorium.
  - Approved the establishment of an ad hoc committee to look at areas that would be included if a moratorium were imposed.
8. Budget and Finance Committee – Defeated the Budget and Finance Committee's recommendation of a dues increase.

**9. Modified Program**

- Approved an editorial change in Modified Volleyball Game Rule #6 allowing the use of a Libero player and a waiver of the uniform requirement.
- Approved in Modified Wrestling a two-year pilot program may be implemented with sectional/league approval that allows modified wrestlers who compete in two or three bouts in a contest to wrestle using the time periods for bouts of "Program 2" which is Period 1 (1 minute) and Periods 2 and 3 (1½ minutes).
- Approved in Modified Boys' Track and Field a two-year pilot program may be implemented with sectional/league approval that would increase the height of the hurdle in the 55m modified boys' event from 30 inches to 33 inches.
- Approved an editorial change in Modified Wrestling Condition #6 that there must be a 45-minute rest period between bouts.

**10. Wrestling – Approved the seeding procedures for the 2008-09 Wrestling State Championships.****11. Forms**

- Approved the revision to the Roster Size form to clarify student-athlete and bench personnel.
- Approved revisions to the Proposal for Change form.

**C. NYSPHSAA EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR - Nina Van Erk**

1. Ms. Van Erk highlighted the January 2009 NYSPHSAA Office Report, mentioning that the "Citizenship Through Athletics Course" will be offered on February 4, 2009, at the NYSPHSAA office. Anyone interested should contact Todd Nelson at [tnelson@nysphsaa.org](mailto:tnelson@nysphsaa.org). This course is offered at no cost.
2. Ms. Van Erk reviewed the postponed items from the October 2008 NYSPHSAA Executive Committee meeting, stating that these items will be discussed at the January Executive Committee meeting.
3. Ms. Van Erk reviewed other items to be covered by the Executive Committee.

**D. COUNSEL – Kevin Seaman**

1. Mr. Seaman provided information to the Athletic Council regarding a Sayville student-athlete's eligibility appeal.
2. Mr. Seaman reviewed with the Athletic Council four Commissioner's decisions with respect to participation in interscholastic athletics.

  - All girls' teams that have a five-person average of 24:00 minutes during a sanction 5K race at Sunken Meadow also qualify.

  - A school that does not meet the above criteria may petition entry into the Section XI Championships."
