NYSPHSAA Scholar-Athlete School of Distinction Presentations – Section XI President, Ross Goldin, presented Commack High School Athletic Coordinator Pat Friel; Islip High School Athletic Director, Bob Panariello; and Sayville High School administrators, Joseph Buderman (Principal), Deborah Van Essendelft (Board of Education President) and Charlie Delargy (Athletic Director) with the NYSPHSAA Scholar-Athlete School of Distinction Award. This award is presented to school districts that have received scholar-athlete recognition (90 or above average) for team members in each varsity sport during the 2008-09 school year.

B. NYSPHSAA Sportsmanship Program Choice – Section XI President, Ross Goldin, recognized the Commack School District as one of three school districts chosen throughout New York State as having an exemplary sportsmanship program.

II. REPORTS**A. Executive Board**

The Executive Board met on Wednesday, September 30, 2009, at 4:00 pm, at the Section XI Office. In attendance: President R. Goldin, M.A. Jules, L. Lally, N. DeCillis, L. Schwartz, J. Dolan, A. Annunziato, P. Sullivan-Kriss, K. Seaman, L. Light; D. Lunetta (Items 1-3); D. Madison (Items 1-4); Michael Lardner, Bryan Butler, and Marty Ehrlich (Item 5); J. Sexton and E. Cinelli. (Absent: P. Nickerson).

1. President – Ross Goldin called the meeting to order at 4:07 pm.
2. Internal Claims Auditor
 - A. Mr. Goldin and Executive Director Ed Cinelli reviewed the reports that were submitted by Section XI Internal Claims Auditor, Helen Maloney. Ms. Maloney noted in her annual report dated September 30, 2009, her concerns regarding the distribution of cash to student-athletes as meal money for state competitions.
 - B. The Executive Director explained a comment made by Ms. Maloney in her September 28, 2009 report regarding the reimbursement of expenses.
 - C. The Executive Board was also given monthly reports from Ms. Maloney for June, 2009, through September, 2009.
3. Coughlin Foundotos Cullen & Danowski, LLP – Deirdre Lunetta
 - A. Deirdre Lunetta from the accounting firm of Coughlin Foundotos Cullen & Danowski, LLP, reviewed the draft of the Management Letter for the period ended June 30, 2009. Ms. Lunetta noted that the Section has taken the necessary action recommended in the previous year's report and that the Section is in “very good financial position”.
 - B. Ms. Lunetta provided a tentative draft of the financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2009 and 2008.
 - C. Ms. Lunetta informed the Executive Board that her firm is working on the tax-exempt status for Section XI and that it will be completed in time for the filing of taxes.
4. Treasurer – Larry Light
 - A. Mr. Light reviewed the Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual report for the period July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009. He explained the income and expenses for the Section, indicating that a portion of the fund balance was used to offset any increases. This was included in the Section XI budget for 2008-09.
 - B. Mr. Light reviewed the Tri-Party Collateral Agreement that Section XI has with State Bank of Long Island and the Bank of New York. We continue to be collateralized to 102%.

5. Media

- A. MSG Varsity – Michael Lardner, Executive Producer of MSG Varsity, along with Bryan Butler and Marty Ehrlich, presented to the Executive Board the MSG Varsity program that is currently being offered to the schools districts and Section XI. A series of questions were asked by the Executive Board members regarding contracts that have been submitted by MSG Varsity for approval.

During discussion, comments were made by Executive Board members regarding the legal issues facing school districts and/or Section XI entering into contracts with MSG Varsity. Superintendents from Section XI and Section VIII have planned to meet to discuss these issues.

- B. Verizon FiOS1 – A letter from Verizon FiOS1 regarding the broadcasting of Long Island high school sports was provided.
- C. Discussion took place regarding a possible parent release form to be used by member schools.
6. Executive Board Vacancy – The Executive Board approved the appointment of Mary Anne Jules as First Vice President for the 2009-10 school year. A vacancy exists for the position of Second Vice President. The Executive Director will announce the opening to the athletic administrators at upcoming Conference meetings and through an e-mail message. The Executive Board will accept applications for this position until October 16, 2009, and an appointment will be made at the January 2010 Executive Board meeting.

7. Counsel – Kevin Seaman

- A. Mr. Seaman reviewed with the Executive Board the court case involving a student-athlete from a member school who participated in a soccer game during the 2008-09 school year.
- B. Mr. Seaman reviewed with the Executive Board correspondence regarding the court case Dowd v. Suffolk County Community College.
- C. Mr. Seaman explained to the Executive Board that periodically, Section XI receives notices from the New York State Department of Labor regarding Unemployment Insurance benefits for officials. Mr. Seaman responds to these notices, indicating that it has been previously determined that Section XI officials are considered independent contractors by the state and not employees and are, therefore, not entitled to unemployment insurance benefits.

8. Finances

- A. The Executive Board approved the following:
- Contractual items
 - Leasing/service agreement continuations
 - Reinstatement of credit card policy with the spending limit of \$5,000 per purchase and a credit line not to exceed \$10,000
- B. The Executive Director provided the Section XI Meal and Refreshment Quarterly Report for the period between May 6, 2009 and September 29, 2009.
- C. The Executive Director provided a report of Section XI Petty Cash Fund expenditures for the period between September 30, 2008 and September 29, 2009.

9. Appointments

- A. The Executive Board approved the following:
- Sport Chairs for the 2009-10 school year.
 - Committee Chairs for the 2009-10 school year.
 - Conference attendance authorization for the 2009-10 school year.

10. NYSPPHSAA – Nick DeCillis, Paula Nickerson, Ed Cinelli (proxy for John Dolan), Lynn Schwartz
 - A. Central Committee - Nick DeCillis provided information regarding the August 4-6, 2009 NYSPPHSAA Central Committee meeting.
 - B. Finances - Nick DeCillis informed the Executive Board that a discussion regarding the reduction of contests will take place at an upcoming NYSPPHSAA meeting. Furthermore, the Budget and Finance Committee of the NYSPPHSAA is recommending a dues increase of \$30 per school and \$.03 per student for the 2010-11 school year.
 - C. NYSPPHSAA Update - Ed Cinelli informed the Executive Board of the new requirements for uncertified teachers to coach in New York State public schools. This information was provided by Trish Kocialski at the NYSPPHSAA meeting in August. Ms. Kocialski also presented this information to Section XI Athletic Directors at their September 16, 2009, meeting.
 - D. Extension of Eligibility - Ed Cinelli provided information to the Executive Board regarding the new Extension of Eligibility procedures for students to be approved for a "5th year" (Extension of Eligibility). The chief school officer is to include an explanation of how the accident/illness resulted in the athlete needing additional semester(s) to meet graduation requirements.
 - E. Hall of Fame – The Executive Board approved the nomination of Nick DeCillis to the 2010 New York State Public High School Athletic Association's Hall of Fame.
11. NYSPPHSAA Office Reports – The Executive Director provided copies of the May and August 2009 NYSPPHSAA Office Reports to the Executive Board.
12. NYSPPHSAA Eligible Voting Members – The Executive Director provided information to the Executive Board regarding a "Request for Proxies" from Section XI for 2009-10 with the names of those eligible to vote at NYSPPHSAA meetings.
13. Executive Director and Staff Salary Negotiations – A committee was formed consisting of Lynn Schwartz, Paula Nickerson, Lisa Lally and Ross Goldin to negotiate a contract for the Executive Director. In addition, Ed Cinelli will discuss with Section XI Finance Committee Chair, Alan Groveman, the process for negotiation for the salary and benefit package of the Section XI Assistant Director and office staff.
14. Goals and Objectives – The Executive Director provided his goals and objectives for the 2009-10 school year. In addition, the Executive Director highlighted the possibility of Section XI using Stony Brook University for wrestling and basketball championships during the 2009-10 school year. Stony Brook University has indicated an interest in Section XI utilizing the facility even through construction of the new arena has not taken place.
15. Computer Issues – The Executive Director provided the Executive Board with information regarding computer spyware that caused the loss of data on one of the Section XI computers. The Section XI computer service company, Oaktree Systems, was extremely helpful in installing backup data. No information was lost in this procedure. Jason May from Oaktree Systems has recommended that the Section purchase another server and install systems to prevent future problems.

16. NYSPPHSAA Sportsmanship Program Choice – The Executive Director provided correspondence from the New York State Public High School Athletic Association announcing that the Commack School District has been chosen as one of three schools throughout New York State to be recognized as having an exemplary sportsmanship program. Additionally, Commack will be honored at the October 8, 2009, Athletic Council meeting.
 17. Scholar/Athlete Team Schools of Distinction – The Executive Director provided correspondence from the NYSPPHSAA naming Commack High School, Islip High School, and Sayville High School as recipients of the 2008-09 Scholar/Athlete Team Schools of Distinction. This honor is being bestowed on these schools by virtue of the fact that each of their varsity interscholastic athletic teams qualified in the NYSPPHSAA Scholar/Athlete Team Award Program, earning a 90% GPA or better during the past school year. These schools will be honored at the October 8, 2009, Athletic Council meeting.
 18. NYSPPHSAA Championship Dates/Sites – The Executive Director provided the Board with information regarding the 2009-10 NYSPPHSAA Championship Dates and Sites.
 19. Boys' Basketball – The Executive Director provided the Executive Board with correspondence from the Presidents of the Western and Eastern Boys' Basketball Officials' Association requesting three officials for all boys' basketball contests in Section XI.
 20. Geographical Placement – The Executive Director provided the Executive Board with correspondence from East Hampton Assistant Superintendent, Dr. Charles Soriano, requesting that the Section provide "geographical placement" for East Hampton. This item will be discussed at the Conference III meeting when appropriate sports placement is on the agenda.
 21. Cross Country – The Executive Director received correspondence from Miriam Newman-Cruz, Park Manager at Sunken Meadow State Park, indicating that there has been an increase in the fee to use Sunken Meadow as a cross country site.
 22. Assistant Director – The Executive Director informed the Executive Board that Assistant Director, Jack Sexton, will undergo knee surgery in mid-November. Discussion took place with respect to approval for the Executive Director to find a substitute Assistant Director for a period of time if needed. This item will be discussed at the next Section XI Executive Board meeting.
- B. NYSPPHSAA Central Committee** – N. DeCillis, P. Nickerson, E. Cinelli*, L. Schwartz
(*Proxy for J. Dolan)
- At its annual meeting of August 4-6, 2009, at the Crowne Plaza, Lake Placid, the NYSPPHSAA Central Committee effected the following:
1. Sport Season - Approved the 2009-10 Section Sport Seasons.
 2. State Championships - Approved date and/or venue changes in the 2009-10 State Championships for Boys' Tennis, Boys' Golf and Girls' Golf.

3. State Coordinators – Approved the reappointment of Bill Higgins as Boys’ Basketball State Coordinator and the appointment of Dylan Bronson as Boys’ Golf Assistant State Coordinator.
4. Football – Approved the penalty for any violation of the Preseason Football Rule. The penalty states: *“For any violation of this rule, the head coach will be suspended from the next regularly scheduled contest. The coach may not be present at the game site nor communicate in any manner during the contest with any person present at the site. Not being present at the site means the disqualified coach is not present in the locker room, on the sidelines, in the stands or site area before, during or after the game.”*
5. Regional Championships – Approved for all sports in Regional championships, host officials will be used unless mutually agreed upon by the participating Sections.
6. Girls’ Basketball
 - Approved a waiver of the NCAA women’s rules to allow Sections to experiment with 16-minute halves in varsity level non-league contests upon mutual agreement of both schools for the 2009-10 season.
 - Approved using 3-person officiating crews for the Regional and State Championships with no additional cost.
7. Boys’ and Girls’ Bowling – Approved that the oil pattern will be announced in advance of the NYSPHSAA Bowling Tournament.
8. Boys’ and Girls’ Swimming & Diving – Approved the definition of a Swimming and Diving uniform to limit the use of tech suits by restricting the individuals to using one swimsuit during competition with the exclusion of divers who may need additional support.
9. Boys’ and Girls’ Volleyball - Approved the time length of all time outs is 60 seconds.
10. Girls’ Gymnastics – Approved the use of the existing *Technical Handbook* along with the 2009 changes and additions.
11. Cheerleading – Approved the formation of an ad hoc committee to study the factors for implementing competitive cheerleading as a sport.
12. Friend and Neighbors – Approved as Friends and Neighbors: Rye Country Day School (Sec I), and Mesivta Ateres Yaakov High School (Sec VIII).
13. Code of Conduct – Approved the protocol and possible penalty for a coach/supervisor who violates #9 of the Code of Conduct.
14. Wrestling - Approved revising the NYSPHSAA Wrestling Skin Lesion Release Form to be consistent with the NFHS form and to add the name of the school.
15. Handbook
 - Approved the addition of language for clarification in #13. Interstate Contests (NYSPHSAA Handbook-p.97)
 - Approved language for clarification to the Sportsmanship Regulation (NYSPHSAA Handbook-p.103)

16. Budget and Finance Committee – Denied the Budget and Finance Committee's recommendation to increase dues for the 2010-11 school year.

- a) The official weight classes for competition are: 74, 80, 86, 92, 98, 104, 110, 116, 122, 128, 134, 140, 148, 155 and 158; and an unlimited weight class will be optional for contestants who are competing weighing within 10 pounds of each other.
- b) Wrestlers must weigh in wearing only their singlet.
- c) The starting time will be 4:30 pm.
- d) There will be a mandatory mat side weigh-in for the competing teams. All other matches will be exhibition using three one-minute periods.
- e) Regular team scoring will be used.
- f) Wrestlers counting for a team score may only wrestle at the above weight classes (no moving a wrestler to a higher weight class).
- g) Exhibition matches will be established based on ability.

The Executive Board met on Thursday, October 08, 2009, following the Section XI Athletic Council meeting, at the Section XI Office. In attendance: President R. Goldin, M.A. Jules, L. Lally, N. DeCillis, L. Schwartz, J. Dolan, P. Sullivan-Kriss, K. Seaman, L. Light; J. Sexton and E. Cinelli. (Absent: A. Annunziato, P. Nickerson).

1. **President** – Ross Goldin called the meeting to order at 9:58 am.
2. **Outside Agency Approval** – The Executive Board granted approval of the following Outside Agency tournament:
 - Suffolk Track Officials Cross Country Invitational
3. **NYSPHSAA Insurance** – The Executive Director supplied the Executive Board with the NYSPHSAA insurance renewal information. Section XI's share of this insurance is estimated at \$8,992.
4. **Central Islip Boys' Soccer Misconduct** – Discussion took place regarding the misconduct of a varsity boys' soccer player from Central Islip High School. The school district informed the Section that said player bumped an official during an October 3, 2009 contest. According to district Athletic Director, Larry Philips, the student-athlete is suspended from the soccer program indefinitely; he will be permitted to apply for reinstatement during the 2010-11 school year. If he decides to do so, there will be a hearing at the school. According to the Athletic Director, the student does not participate in any other interscholastic athletics.
