2. President Ross Goldin announced that John C. Sexton, Section XI Assistant Director, will be retiring from Section XI after 18 years of service. The search for a new Assistant Director will begin shortly.

## **II. REPORTS**

### **A. EXECUTIVE BOARD**

The Executive Board met on Monday, January 4, 2010, at 4:00 pm, at the Section XI Office. In attendance: President R. Goldin, M.A. Jules, L. Lally, N. DeCillis, L. Schwartz, J. Dolan, P. Nickerson, A. Annunziato, P. Sullivan-Kriss, K. Seaman, L. Light, A. Groveman, J. Sexton and E. Cinelli.

1. **President** – Ross Goldin called the meeting to order at 4:10 pm.
2. **Treasurer's Report** – Larry Light  
Mr. Light reviewed the Section XI Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual report for the period July 1, 2009 through December 23, 2009, and provided information to the Executive Board regarding the income and expenses of the Section for this time period.
3. **Counsel** – Kevin Seaman
  - A. Mr. Seaman reviewed correspondence that he had with a law office regarding the agreement between Section XI and MSG Varsity. According to the Section XI Media Policy, "Section XI shall determine appropriate fees for broadcasting and telecast rights."
  - B. Mr. Seaman reviewed with the Executive Board the settlement in the *Dowd v. Suffolk County Community College* claim.
4. **Finance Committee** – Alan Groveman
  - A. The Section XI Finance Committee Chair, Alan Groveman, reviewed the December 1, 2009 Finance Committee meeting report, including the proposed 2010-11 budget. The Finance Committee approved the 2010-11 budget, which contains no increase in Dues and Service Charges to Section XI member schools, along with the appropriation of \$258,403 to the budget from the fund balance.
  - B. Mr. Groveman commented that the 2008-09 audit and management letter by Coughlin Foundotos Cullen & Danowski, LLP did not identify financial items that need to be addressed by the Section.
5. **OMNI 403(b) Compliance** – Ed Cinelli  
The Executive Board approved by resolution the amendment to the Section XI 403(b) plan document that will permit all employees of Section XI to be eligible to participate in the plan.
6. **State Bank – "Business on Line" (Direct Deposit)** - The Executive Board approved by resolution the use of "Business on Line" banking services of State Bank of Long Island.
7. **Internal Auditor's Report** – Ross Goldin
  - A. Mr. Goldin discussed with the Executive Board the Internal Auditor's reports for October 30<sup>th</sup>, November 30<sup>th</sup> and December 29<sup>th</sup>.
  - B. The Executive Board approved an increase in the stipend for the Internal Auditor, retroactive to July 1, 2009.

8. **Negotiations**
  - A. The Executive Board approved the Section XI office staff working agreement for the period July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2012, based upon the recommendation made by Section XI Finance Committee Chairman, Alan Groveman, and a subcommittee consisting of Finance Committee members.
  - B. The Executive Board approved a three-year agreement with the Section XI Executive Director, Ed Cinelli.
  
9. **NYSPSHAA** – Nick DeCillis, Paula Nickerson
  - A. Paula Nickerson and Nick DeCillis provided information regarding the December 6 & 7, 2009, NYSPHSAA Executive Committee meeting held in Albany. Mr. DeCillis highlighted that there will be a dues increase of \$30 per school and \$.03 per student for the 2010-11 school year. Mr. DeCillis also led a discussion regarding the maximum number of contests that the state approved for 2009-10 and 2010-11. Additionally, Mr. DeCillis announced that on January 21, 2010, there will be a conference call involving the Section representatives to approve the classification variations in Cross Country, Boys' and Girls' Volleyball, Field Hockey, and Boys' and Girls' Lacrosse.
  - B. NYSPHSAA Office reports for October and November, 2009, were distributed to the Executive Board.
  - C. A discussion took place regarding the NYSPHSAA classifications and the fact that Section XI will have 32 AA schools in the 2010-11 school year in the sports of Boys' and Girls' Soccer, Boys' and Girls' Basketball, Baseball and Softball.
  
10. **SED Update** - The Executive Director provided information regarding the New York State Education Department update. This information was provided by Patricia Kocialski. It outlined questions regarding athletic eligibility issues, specifically the 19-year old rule that continues to be challenged.
  
11. **NYSPHSAA Chief School Officer Representative** - The Executive Board approved Lynn Schwartz as the Section XI Chief School Officer Representative for the 4-year term beginning July 1, 2010.
  
12. **NYSPHSAA Second Vice President Principal Opening** - The Executive Director distributed correspondence from NYSPHSAA Past President, Ron Black, explaining that the Second Vice President position of the NYSPHSAA Central Committee will be open. Any principal interested should contact Mr. Black.
  
13. **Section XI Vice President Appointment** - The Executive Board approved Commack Athletic Director Jeremy Thode as the Executive Board's Second Vice President for the 2009-10 school year. The Board thanked the other candidates who showed interest in the position.
  
14. **Championship Philosophy Committee** – Lisa Lally  
Lisa Lally provided the Executive Board with information regarding the October 15, 2009, Championship Philosophy Committee meeting. Ms. Lally indicated that the collection of information from Executive Directors is taking place as the Committee would like to know the qualifying procedures for championships that take place in each Section.
  
15. **Boys' Swimming Sponsorship** - A discussion took place regarding the Section XI Boys' Swimming championship sponsorship by the Air National Guard. The Executive Director will gather more information from NYSPHSAA Assistant Director, Joe Altieri, regarding this agreement.

16. **Section XI Rental Cost Comparisons** - The Executive Director provided an outline of the Section costs to rent facilities during the Fall 2009 championships as well as the income earned from gate receipts at these events.
17. **Facility Cost Comparisons** - The Executive Director provided a three-year cost comparison for Section XI Championships for basketball and wrestling at Stony Brook University, Farmingdale State College and Hofstra University.
18. **Outside Agency Approval** - The Executive Board approved the following outside agencies to conduct tournaments within Section XI:
  - Eastern Long Island Basketball Officials Holiday Classic, December 29-30, 2009
  - IAABO Board 127 Bob Grant Tip Office Classic, December 11-12, 2009
19. **Concussion Policy** - Discussion took place regarding the Section XI role in developing and/or providing leadership for schools to adopt concussion policies as they relate to interscholastic athletics. The Section XI Safety Committee will meet to discuss this item.
20. **Basketball Officials**
  - A. The Executive Director provided correspondence from the boys' basketball officials associations regarding three-man officiating at Section XI tournaments. The Executive Board agreed that if three-man officiating takes place, it would be at no additional cost to the Section.
  - B. The Executive Director provided the Board with information regarding an incident that took place at a boys' basketball contest that involved the ejection of a coach.
21. **Boys' Soccer Incident** - The Executive Director provided the Board with correspondence from a member school regarding the suspension of a boys' soccer player for an unsportsmanlike act.
22. **Fingerprinting** - The Executive Director provided information regarding a "Denial of Clearance" for an official. This official has been notified of the situation.
23. **Executive Director Goals and Objectives – Mid-Year Report** - The Executive Director provided the Board with his mid-year report.
24. **NYSPHSAA Hall of Fame** - Executive Director Ed Cinelli has submitted the application for Nick DeCillis to be inducted into the NYSPHSAA Hall of Fame in 2010.
25. **Section XI Quarterly Expenses** - The Executive Director provided the Executive Board with the Meals and Refreshment expenses for the period September 30, 2009 through January 3, 2010.
26. **Football Incidents** - The Executive Director provided correspondence from two schools regarding incidents that took place during the Fall 2009 football season.
27. **NYSPHSAA Championships – Future Dates** - The Board was provided with a listing of the NYSPHSAA Championships Dates and Sites for the 2010-11 school year.
28. **Assistant Director** - Mr. John Sexton announced his intention to retire effective June 30, 2010. This will conclude Jack's 18 years of service to Section XI. A planning committee was appointed to formulate a process for the selection of a new Assistant Director.

**B. NYSPHSAA EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE** – N. DeCillis, P. Nickerson

At its December 6-7, 2009 meeting, the NYSPHSAA Executive Committee effected the following:

**APPROVED ITEMS:**

1. **Proposed Dues Increase** - \$30 per school and \$.03 per student for the 2010-2011 school year.
2. **Classification of Schools** – The official enrollments numbers for the 2010-2011 classification of schools.
3. **Cut Off Numbers** – A change in the classification cutoff numbers for the 2010-2011 school year.

4. **Friend and Neighbor:**
  - Christian Central Academy (Effective August 2009)
  - Northern Chautauqua Catholic School (Effective October 2009)
5. **Membership**
  - Global Concepts Charter School (Effective November 2, 2009)
6. **2011 – 2012 Championship Sites and Dates**
7. **Rotation for Track and Field Championship** – Every other year at Cicero-North Syracuse and alternate between Sections 2-4-9 in the odd years.
8. **Sport Coordinator Appointments:** Marbry Gansle (Girls Gymnastics and Girls Cross Country), Judy Hartmann (Boys Volleyball), Dennis O'Brien (Boys Skiing), Bob Underwood (Girls Skiing) and Jacquie Gow (Girls Lacrosse).
9. **Bowling** – With Section approval, a combination tournament that will consist of a maximum of three (3) standard team games and a maximum of fifteen (15) Baker style games will be permitted in Sectional competition only.
10. **Girls Basketball** – A waiver from the NCAA Rule Book requiring two (2) visible shot clocks, one (1) at each end of the court. If the shot clocks are not functional, the waiver would permit the game to be played with an alternate timing device.
11. **Boys Basketball** - Use of NFHS Rule 2-2-1 for all NYSPHSAA Championship semi-final and final games if it can be done at no additional expense to the Association.
12. **Wrestling**
  - Starting weight class is still drawn, recommendation to follow the Federation Rule and have the pre-meet disc toss for choice of odd/even matches in dual meet matches. This would be a removal of the waiver already in place.
  - Waiver of NFHS Rule 4-5-3 regarding dual meet and tournament weigh-ins.

- PSAL and CHSAA to receive at-large bids if they placed in the top 4 of the preceding year's NYS State Tournament.
13. **Softball** – A waiver of ASA Softball rules to prohibit the use of metal cleats.
  14. **Ice Hockey** - Recommends two (2) divisions based on enrollment with a cutoff of Division I -1100 and up, and Division II – 1099 and below.
  15. **Budget and Finance Committee** –Adoption of a Conflict of Interest Statement policy.
  16. **Modified Athletics**
    - Baseball and Softball - players may be allowed to reenter a contest to replace an injured player only if all eligible substitutions were used during the game.
    - Softball - With sectional/league approval, a two year pilot program in modified softball may be implemented that shall allow innings 1-6 to be completed at five runs or three outs. The 7<sup>th</sup> inning shall be played as a normal inning, with three outs and no run restrictions.
    - Badminton and Tennis - Each player may play one additional singles or doubles match per day. The individual limitations/day for badminton and tennis (Reference: Modified Sports Standards Chart, NYSPHSAA handbook, pages 134-5) shall be increased to two matches per day, provided that every individual eligible player plays once before any player plays twice.
    - Micki Bedlington (Section I) as the NYSPHSAA girls' softball sport coordinator.
  17. **Section II Wrestling Season Dates** – Section II requests changing the start of the wrestling season to November 9, 2009 for all schools except Green Tech, Christian Brothers Academy, Albany and Warrensburg.

#### **DEFEATED ITEMS:**

1. **Maximum Number of Contests** - Action to reinstate the maximum number of contests in all sports for the 2010-11 school year.

#### **FUTURE DISCUSSION and REVIEW**

1. **Practices** - Athletes who switch from a contact/collision or limited contact/impact sport to a strenuous/non contact or nonstrenuous/non contact sport are permitted to count conditioning practices toward their new sport as follows: 1. Sports with less than ten (10) practices for the individual before the first contest will be allowed to carry over three (3) days; 2. Sports with less than ten to fifteen (10-15) practices for the individual before the first contest will be allowed to carry over four (4) days. (Contact/collision or limited contact/impact sports include field hockey, football, ice hockey, lacrosse, soccer, wrestling, baseball, softball, diving, gymnastics, skiing, softball and volleyball. Strenuous/non contact or nonstrenuous/non contact sports include cross country, track and field, swimming, tennis, bowling, golf and riflery).
2. **Sportsmanship** - When coaches do not fulfill the penalty of the Sportsmanship Regulation by being present at the site of the contest the coach has not fulfilled the penalty and remains ineligible to coach. The committee felt that during the regular season and sectional activity, the Section should impose a penalty on the coach/school. During regional and state championship activity, the NYSPHSAA Executive Director should impose the penalty.
3. **Sport Rules** - A review, discussion and vote to use the same rules for Boys and Girls Basketball and NFHS rules for all sports when available.

**C. NYSPPHSAA EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR** - Nina Van Erk

1. Maximum Number of Contests - Ms. Van Erk announced that a mistake was made in the school year under the "Maximum Number of Contests – Defeated" section of the January 2010 NYSPPHSAA Office Report. It should read that the NYSPPHSAA Executive Committee defeated the action to reinstate the maximum number of contests in all sports for the **2010-11** school year.
2. Citizenship Through Athletics - Ms. Van Erk announced that the Citizenship Through Athletics program will be held on February 3, 2010, at the NYSPPHSAA office. There is no registration fee.
3. Field Hockey Uniform Change - Beginning in the fall, 2011, single solid white (home) and single solid dark/black (away) uniforms will be required for varsity contests.
4. Cheerleading - A Cheerleading Committee meeting will be held on February 2, 2010. Len Kies will represent Section XI at that meeting.
5. Executive Committee Meeting - The next meeting of the NYSPPHSAA Executive Committee will be held on January 21, 2010, via a conference call. At that meeting, the cut-off numbers for classification will be approved for Boys' and Girls' Volleyball, Boys' and Girls' Cross Country, Field Hockey, and Boys' and Girls' Lacrosse.

**D. COUNSEL** - Kevin Seaman

1. Mr. Seaman reviewed discussions that took place regarding the MSG Varsity contract and Section XI.
2. Mr. Seaman reviewed discussions the Executive Board had regarding concussions and Section XI's role in concussion management as well as the NYSPPHSAA dissemination of information on this topic. This item will be referred to the Section XI Safety Committee.

**III. INPUT FOR NYSPPHSAA** (Discussion Only)**A. Practices**

*"Athletes who switch from a contact/collision or limited contact/impact sport to a strenuous/non-contact or non-strenuous/non-contact sport are permitted to count conditioning practices toward their new sport as follows: 1) Sports with less than ten (10) practices for the individual before the first contest will be allowed to carry over three (3) days; 2) Sports with less than ten to fifteen (10-15) practices for the individual before the first contest will be allowed to carry over four (4) days. (Contact/collision or limited contact/impact sports include field hockey, football, ice hockey, lacrosse, soccer, wrestling, baseball, softball, diving, gymnastics, skiing, softball and volleyball. Strenuous/non-contact or non-strenuous/non-contact sports include cross country, track and field, swimming, tennis, bowling, golf and riflery)."*

The Conferences are generally in favor of the concept of allowing practices to count for athletes who switch from one sport to another. There was a feeling that this would be especially true for student-athletes who try out and do not make a team and are willing to try another sport.

**B. Sportsmanship**

*"When coaches do not fulfill the penalty of the Sportsmanship Regulation by being present at the site of the contest, the coach has not fulfilled the penalty and remains ineligible to coach. The Committee felt that during the regular season and sectional activity, the Section should impose a penalty on the coach/school. During regional and state championship activity, the NYSPPHSAA Executive Director should impose the penalty."*

There was a mixed feeling among the Conferences regarding this legislation of penalties for a sportsmanship regulation that is violated during a regional or state activity.

C. Sport Rules

"A review, discussion and vote to use the same rules for Boys' and Girls' Basketball and NFHS rules for all sports when available."

The Conferences feel that sports rules for Boys' and Girls' Basketball and NFHS rules for all sports should be consistent.
