**B. NYSPHSAA Scholar-Athlete School of Distinction Presentations** – Section XI

President Mary Anne Jules and NYSPHSAA Assistant Director Bob Stulmaker presented Half Hollow Hills administrators, Dr. Sheldon Karnilow (Superintendent), Deb Intoricia (Half Hollow Hills West Principal), Dr. Jeff Woodberry (Half Hollow Hills East Principal), and Joe Pennacchio (Athletic Director); Smithtown administrators Ed Ehmann (Superintendent), John Cody (Smithtown West Principal), Ed Thompson (Smithtown East Principal), and Pat Smith (Athletic Director); and Sayville administrators Dr. Walter Schartner (Superintendent), Ron Hoffer (Principal) and Dennis Maloney (Athletic

Director) with the NYSPHSAA Scholar-Athlete School of Distinction Award. This award is presented to member schools that have received scholar-athlete recognition (90 or above average) for team members in each varsity sport during the 2009-10 school year. Mr. Stulmaker announced that there were nineteen Scholar-Athlete School of Distinction winners in New York State during the 2009-10 school year, five of which were in Section XI.

- C. **Scholar-Athlete Teams** – The listing of Section XI Scholar-Athlete Teams for the Spring 2010 sports season was distributed to the Athletic Council (Attachment A). President Jules congratulated those school teams for their achievement.

## II. **REPORTS**

### A. **Executive Board**

The Executive Board met on Monday, October 4, 2010, at 4:00 pm, at the Section XI Office. In attendance: President M. A. Jules, J. Thode, J. Polansky, L. Lally, N. DeCillis, P. Nickerson, A. Annunziato, K. Seaman, L. Light; D. Lunetta (Items 1-3); H. Maloney (Items 1-3); D. Webster and E. Cinelli. (Absent: L. Schwartz, J. Dolan, and P. Sullivan-Kriss).

1. President – Mary Anne Jules called the meeting to order at 4:04 pm.
2. Internal Claims Auditor
  - A. Section XI Internal Claims Auditor Helen Maloney reviewed with the Board the annual report that she submitted on September 24, 2010. Ms. Maloney noted in her report her concerns that officials should be required to submit only the last four digits of their Social Security numbers on claim forms for security purposes. Also, all files and cabinets that contain official's and staff member's claim forms, Social Security numbers, and other financial data should be locked for security purposes. Executive Director Ed Cinelli announced that the Section has made plans to implement these items.
  - B. Ms. Maloney feels that the Association should establish procedures to have the Treasurer sign all checks. The President and Vice Presidents should be alternate signers.
  - C. Ms. Maloney voiced her concern regarding the distribution of checks that are to be cashed by the Executive Director that provide meal money for student-athletes who participate in state championships.
3. Cullen & Danowski, LLP – Deirdre Lunetta
  - A. Deirdre Lunetta from the accounting firm of Cullen & Danowski, LLP, commented on Internal Claim Auditor Helen Maloney's report regarding Section XI check signing procedures. Ms. Lunetta was satisfied with the current procedures that are in place in Section XI regarding check signing. She feels it is not necessary to have the Treasurer sign checks on a regular basis.
  - B. Ms. Lunetta reviewed the draft of the management letter for the period ending June 30, 2010. She feels that the Section is in good financial situation and there are no additional recommendations. The Section will have to make the decision with respect to the use of undesignated net assets to be used in preparing for the 2011-12 budget.
  - C. Ms. Lunetta provided a tentative draft of the financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2010 and 2009.
  - D. Ms. Lunetta discussed with the Executive Board an article that appeared in a New Jersey newspaper regarding the audit of the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association.

4. Treasurer – Larry Light
  - A. Mr. Light reviewed the Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual report for the period July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010. He outlined the income and expenses for the Section, indicating that a portion of the fund balance was used to offset any increases.
  - B. Mr. Light reviewed the Tri-Party Collateral Agreement that Section XI has with State Bank of Long Island and the Bank of New York.
5. Counsel – Kevin Seaman
  - A. Mr. Seaman commented on the letter that Section XI received from the Department of Labor regarding their determination that there is insufficient evidence of supervision, direction and control of game officials to establish an employment relationship for unemployment insurance purposes. As such, game officials are considered "Independent Contractors."
6. Finances
  - A. The Executive Board approved the following:

    - Reinstatement of credit card policy with the spending limit of \$5,000 per purchase and a credit line not to exceed \$10,000
  - B. The Executive Director provided the Section XI Meal and Refreshment Quarterly Report for the period between May 3, 2010 and October 3, 2010.
  - C. The Executive Director provided a report of Section XI Petty Cash Fund expenditures for the period between September 30, 2009 and October 1, 2010.
  - D. Corporate Banking Resolutions - The Executive Board approved Treasurer Larry Light, Assistant Director Don Webster, and Executive Director Ed Cinelli as the designated check signers for the following Section XI bank accounts:

7. Appointments
  - A. The Executive Board approved the following:

    - Committee Chairs for the 2010-11 school year.
    - Conference attendance authorization for the 2010-11 school year.
    - Reappointment of Larry Light as Section XI Treasurer for a five-year term beginning in 2011-12.
    - Reappointment of Helen Maloney as Internal Claims Auditor for the 2011-12 school year.
8. NYSPHSAA – Nick DeCillis, Paula Nickerson, Ed Cinelli (proxy for John Dolan), Lynn Schwartz
  - A. Central Committee - Nick DeCillis provided information regarding the August 3-5, 2010 NYSPHSAA Central Committee meeting. Discussion took place regarding the continuation of the fiscal restrictions that were approved for the 2008-10 school years. This item will be discussed and voted on at the upcoming NYSPHSAA Executive Committee meeting.
  - B. Hall of Fame – Congratulations were extended to Nick DeCillis on his induction into the NYSPHSAA Hall of Fame.
  - C. 5<sup>th</sup> Year of Athletic Eligibility for Students with Disabilities – Ed Cinelli gave a report to the Executive Board regarding the Commissioner's regulation that allows a 5<sup>th</sup> year of athletic eligibility for students with disabilities.

9. NYSPPHSAA Office Reports – The Executive Director provided copies of the June, September and October 2010 NYSPPHSAA Office Reports to the Executive Board.
10. NYSPPHSAA Eligible Voting Members – The Executive Director provided information to the Executive Board regarding a “Request for Proxies” from Section XI for 2010-11 with the names of those eligible to vote at NYSPPHSAA meetings.
11. Goals and Objectives – The Executive Director provided his goals and objectives for the 2010-11 school year. He reviewed with the Board the relationship that the Section has with Stony Brook University when scheduling wrestling and boys’ basketball. Discussion also took place regarding concussion management and a Section XI webpage computer survey. The Executive Director is also looking into the possibility of using online ticket sales for Section XI events.
12. Pupil Benefits Plan – The Executive Director announced that he has been appointed to the Pupil Benefits Plan Board of Directors.
13. Sunken Meadow – The Executive Director reviewed correspondence from the New York State Office of Parks and Recreation regarding an increase in fees and the establishment of parking fees for school buses.
14. Coaching Certification – The Executive Director provided information regarding coaching certification update of procedures.
15. Scholar/Athlete Team Schools of Distinction – The Executive Director provided correspondence from the NYSPPHSAA naming Half Hollow Hills East, Half Hollow Hills West, Smithtown East, Smithtown West, and Sayville High Schools as recipients of the 2009-10 Scholar/Athlete Team Schools of Distinction. This honor is being bestowed on these schools by virtue of the fact that each of their varsity interscholastic athletic teams qualified in the NYSPPHSAA Scholar/Athlete Team Award Program, earning a 90% GPA or better during the past school year. These schools will be honored at the October 13, 2010, Athletic Council meeting.
16. Upper Room Christian School – The Executive Board denied an application from the Upper Room Christian School for Friends and Neighbor Status.
17. Mixed Competition – The Executive Director provided a report regarding the approval of a male student-athlete participating on a field hockey team.
18. NYSPPHSAA Championship Dates/Sites – The Executive Director provided the Board with information regarding the 2010-11 NYSPPHSAA Championship Dates and Sites.
19. Suffolk Sports Hall of Fame – The Executive Director announced that he has nominated former Section XI Executive Director Catherine D. Gallagher for induction into the Suffolk Sports Hall of Fame.

**B. NYSPPHSAA – Bob Stulmaker**

1. Code of Conduct – Mr. Stulmaker announced that Section XI has been given a limited number of NYSPPHSAA Code of Conduct booklets. If schools or sport chairs are in need of additional copies, they are available on the NYSPPHSAA website. They are also listed in the Athletic Director’s Toolkit that was distributed to all Athletic Directors earlier this month.

2. Baseball Bats – There have been many questions regarding composite bats that are used in Baseball. A listing of approved bats for the 2011 season can be found on the NFHS website, [www.NFHS.org](http://www.NFHS.org) – Keyword: Bat.
3. Skin Infection Webinar – The NYSPHSAA has developed a Skin Infection Webinar for its member schools. This webinar was put together in collaboration with the National Wrestling Coaches Association and the New York State Department of Health. The webinar provides information on the handling, prevention, and care of skin infections. Athletic administrators have been given the dates and times of the webinar. Additionally, Section XI wrestling coaches will take part in the webinar at their November 9, 2010, mandatory coaches' meeting at Longwood High School at 7 pm.
4. Participation Survey – A reminder was given that participation surveys are due to the NYSPHSAA.

**C. NYSPHSAA Central Committee** – N. DeCillis, P. Nickerson, E. Cinelli\*, L. Schwartz  
(\*Proxy for J. Dolan)

At its annual meeting on August 3-5, 2010, at the Holiday Valley Resort, Ellicottville, the NYSPHSAA Central Committee effected the following:

1. Friend and Neighbor - Approved Friend and Neighbor status will be granted for a two-year period beginning September and ending August 31.
2. State Championships - Approved 2010-11 State Championship site changes in the sports of Boys' Swimming & Diving, Boys' & Girls' Skiing; and Boys' and Girls' Bowling.
3. Fact Finders/Arbitration Guidelines – Approved taking back to the Sections for discussion and review the drafts of the new Fact Finders Process Guidelines and the Arbitration Process Guidelines.
4. Championship Gate List – Approved the use of a Championship Gate List for team sports for the Fall State Championships semi-finals and finals.
5. Transfer Appeal Guidelines – Approved a change in the Transfer Appeal Guidelines under the Educational Waiver that academic advantage is limited to courses that can be taught in public schools beginning in the 2011-2012 school year.
6. Charter Schools – Approved that all Sections will establish a process for the review of the classification of all non-public and Charter Schools in their Section.
7. Wrestling – Approved a maximum of 2 two-day dual meet tournaments will be allowed during the season in Wrestling.
8. Cross Country – Approved to continue the site rotation in Cross Country.
9. Fiscal Concerns
  - Defeated a motion to table the discussion on a one-year extension of the fiscal concerns recommendations for the 2011-2012 school year.
  - Approved to postpone discussion on the one-year extension of the fiscal concerns recommendations to the December 2010 Executive Committee meeting.

10. Uniforms – Approved it will be the individual Sections’ option to wear sectional uniforms when participating in Individual sports at the State Championships.
11. NYSPPHSAA Staff Issues – Approved a deferred compensation agreement for Nina Van Erk’s retirement to satisfy all legal requirements needed by the IRS and NYSPHSAA’s auditors.
12. NYSPPHSAA Officers - Approved Stephen Broadwell, Principal Representative of Section VII, as 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President in the officer rotation.
13. Boys’ Soccer – Approved in Boys’ Soccer that a 4<sup>th</sup> official be used in the Semi-Finals and Finals of the State Tournament as a two-year experiment and to report back to the CAC with an evaluation.
14. NFHS Concussion Rule – Approved sending out clarification to all sport official groups and member schools regarding the NFHS concussion rule.
15. Officials Agreement – Approved amending and adding language to the Officials Agreement.

1. - 5) In regional competition, the use of host officials will occur unless mutually agreed upon by the participating Sections.

**V. NEW BUSINESS**

1. BEDS Report - Executive Director Ed Cinelli announced that the BEDS Report is due to the Section XI office by November 1, 2010.
2. Concussion Rule – A lengthy discussion took place regarding the NFHS Concussion Rule and the New York State Education Department’s policy on clearing athletes by an appropriate healthcare professional. Bob Stulmaker provided information regarding this item that verified procedures schools must take with respect to this NFHS rule on concussions.

***Officials are to remove athletes who exhibit sign/symptoms of head injury.***

*The NFHS Concussion Rule states, "Any athlete who exhibits signs, symptoms or behaviors consistent with a concussion (such as loss of consciousness, headaches, dizziness, confusion or balance problems) shall be immediately removed from the contest and shall not return to play until cleared by an appropriate health-care professional".*

*SED’s policy on "cleared by an appropriate health-care professional":*

- 1) *New York State only permits the school medical officer to clear an athlete to return to play after removal from a game for exhibiting the signs/symptoms of a concussion.*
- 2) *If the school medical officer is not available on the sideline to allow a safe return to play, the athlete must remain out of the game until cleared by the school medical officer to return to play.*
