II. REPORTS**A. EXECUTIVE BOARD**

The Executive Board met on Tuesday, January 3, 2012, at 4:00 pm, in the Section XI office. In attendance: President M. A. Jules, J. Thode, J. Polansky, L. Lally, N. DeCillis, P. Sullivan-Kriss, J. Dolan, L. Light, A. Groveman, D. Webster and E. Cinelli. (Absent: A. Annunziato, A. Gerstenlauer, K. Seaman)

1. President – Mary Anne Jules called the meeting to order at 4:08 pm.
2. Finance Committee – Alan Groveman
 - A. The Section XI Finance Committee Chair, Alan Groveman, reviewed the December 6, 2011 Finance Committee meeting report, including the proposed 2012-13 budget.
 - B. Mr. Groveman announced that there is no increase in the Section XI Dues and Service Charges for member schools in the proposed 2012-13 budget. Additionally, there will be no allocation for meal money for student-athletes and supervisors traveling to state championships. Mr. Groveman reviewed with the Executive Board the “possibility” of schools funding their own participation in NYSPHSAA championships should the Section XI budget be unable to support these events.
 - C. Mr. Groveman reported that the Section XI Finance Committee unanimously approved the “Work Agreement” for the Section XI staff for the period July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2014.
3. Treasurer’s Report – Larry Light
Mr. Light reviewed the Section XI Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual report for the period July 1, 2011 through December 29, 2011, and provided information regarding the income and expenses within that budget period. In addition, Mr. Light highlighted the use of the Section XI fund balance to offset expenses to member schools.
4. Internal Auditor’s Report – Mary Anne Jules
Ms. Jules provided the Executive Board with the Internal Auditor’s report dated November 29, 2011 for the months of October and November 2011.
5. Fiscal Issues Committee – Nick DeCillis/Lisa Lally
Ms. Lally reviewed the minutes from the October 26, 2011, and November 30, 2011, Fiscal Issues Committee meetings. Discussion took place regarding cost-saving measures that member schools might consider adopting. The Fiscal Issues Committee will meet again on Tuesday, January 10, 2012; sport chairs of “team sports” are invited to attend this meeting.
6. NYSPSHAA – Nick DeCillis/Lisa Lally
 - A. Mr. DeCillis provided a synopsis of the October 23-24, 2011, NYSPHSAA Executive Committee meeting held in Albany.
 - B. NYSPHSAA Office reports for November and December 2011, and January 2012 were provided.
 - C. The October 2011 NYSED Physical Education Update was distributed.
 - D. Mr. DeCillis announced that the next NYSPHSAA Executive Committee meeting will be held in Latham on January 22, 2012. He feels the agenda will be lengthy.

7. Team Total Update – Don Webster
Don Webster provided the Executive Board with information regarding the reduction in teams through the Winter 2011-12 season and the corresponding loss of revenue. To date, the Section has lost 128 teams and \$22,889 in revenue. This does not reflect any additional losses from the upcoming Modified Spring sports season.
8. Outside Agency Approval – The Executive Board retroactively approved the following outside agencies to conduct tournaments within Section XI:
 - Eastern Suffolk Officials Boys' Basketball Tournament – December 29-30, 2011
 - Western Suffolk Officials Boys' Basketball Tournament – December 28-29, 2011
9. Officials Fees – Nick DeCillis updated the Executive Board on the officials' fees associated with the current contract which ends with the 2012-13 school year.
10. Proposed 2012-13 Section XI Staffing – Ed Cinelli provided the Executive Board with a proposed Section XI staffing profile for 2012-13.
11. NYSPPHSAA Hall of Fame – Ed Cinelli announced that the Section has submitted the application of Huntington Wrestling Coach, Lou Giani, for induction into the NYSPPHSAA Hall of Fame in August, 2012.
12. Official's Claim Dispute – Ed Cinelli informed the Executive Board of a situation regarding an official who had not submitted claims forms during a 16-year period.
13. Stony Brook University Facility Use – Ed Cinelli reviewed the costs associated with the rental of Stony Brook University for the Section XI football and lacrosse championships. Mr. Cinelli will follow up with Stony Brook University regarding the use of their facility for wrestling, basketball and lacrosse.
14. NYSPPHSAA Championship Program Officials Recruitment Ad – Ed Cinelli provided the Executive Board with an invoice Section XI has received from the state association for a 2010-11 championship program ad.
15. Coastal Charter Service Corporation – The Executive Board approved the Coastal Charter Service Corporation (Montauk Bus) to provide Section XI schools with transportation to state championships during the 2011-12 school year.
16. Long Island Girls' Tennis Championship Issue – Ed Cinelli provided correspondence from the Half Hollow Hills Athletic Director regarding an incident that occurred during the Long Island Girls' Tennis Championships on November 1, 2011.
17. Executive Director Goals and Objectives – Mid-Year Report – Ed Cinelli provided the Board with his mid-year report.
18. Section XI Quarterly Expenses – Ed Cinelli provided the Executive Board with the Meals and Refreshment expenses for the period October 3, 2011 through January 2, 2012.
19. MSG Varsity – Ed Cinelli provided a chart indicating the number of Section XI contests that have been broadcast by MSG Varsity.

20. NYSPPHSAA Participation Survey – Ed Cinelli provided the NYSPPHSAA 2010-11 Participation Survey results, indicating that Section XI has more student-athletes participating in interscholastic athletics than any other Section throughout the state.

21. Mixed Competition

- A. Ed Cinelli shared with the Executive Board an article regarding a mixed competition situation in Massachusetts where a girl swimmer defeated a boy to win a girls' swim title. Apparently, boys are allowed to participate in girls' team championships in that state.
- B. Ed Cinelli announced that he has received a request from the Southampton Athletic Director to conduct a Mixed Competition review in February to determine whether the Section would permit the Southampton male field hockey player to continue to participate on the varsity field hockey team during the 2012-13 school year.

B. NYSPPHSAA EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE – N. DeCillis, L. Lally

At its meeting on October 23-24, 2011, the NYSPPHSAA Executive Committee effected the following:

1. Championship Dates and Sites – Approved the following: Girls' Golf at SUNY Delhi (Sec IV) in 2012; Outdoor Track and Field at Middletown High School (Sec IX) in 2013; and Wrestling at the Times Union Center (Sec II) in 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016.
2. Swimming and Diving
 - a. Approved the use of the NFHS Metric Conversion Chart when applicable.
 - b. Approved the revision of Boys' Swimming and Diving Qualifying Times for the 2011-12 State Championship.
3. Girls' Basketball
 - a. Approved a waiver of the NCAA Rule 1-7 to maintain the 3-point line at a distance of 19'9".
 - b. Approved a waiver of the NCAA Rule 1 requiring the use of the restricted area arc.
4. Modified Committee
 - a. Modified Program Competition – Approved the Handbook Committee to revise the Modified General Eligibility Rule #1 to include the word "geography" among the criteria for organization of competition.
 - b. Softball – Approved "with Section/League approval, innings 1-6 may be completed at five (5) runs or three (3) outs. The seventh inning shall be played as a normal inning, with three outs and no run restrictions for that inning."
 - c. Track and Field
 - Approved "with Section/League approval, the height of the hurdle in the 55m modified boys' hurdles may be increased from 30 inches to 33 inches."
 - Approved "with Section/League approval, a six (6) pound shot put may be used for modified girls' track and field, rather than a 4K shot put."
5. Girls' Lacrosse – Approved a 4th official (table official) to be used at the State Semi-Finals and Finals.
6. Sportsmanship – Approved the distribution of the Sportsmanship Brochure to member schools.

C. FISCAL ISSUES COMMITTEE – Nick DeCillis/Lisa Lally

Discussion took place regarding the costs associated with the NYSPHSAA championship events. Further discussion was initiated regarding the travel expenses that Section XI incurs when participating in state championships. It was mentioned that as many as six state championships will be held in the Syracuse area during the 2011-12 school year, with no championships being held on Long Island. This item will be brought to the state association by Nick DeCillis and Lisa Lally at the January 22, 2012 meeting.

III. NYSPHSAA ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION/ACTION**A. Waivers**

1. Motion: D. Ferry Second: D. Walker

To approve the following:

"Shall financial and academic hardship waivers be eliminated from the NYSPHSAA Transfer Appeal Guidelines." Note: Members of the NYSPHSAA Transfer Committee felt strongly that the only waiver that should remain was the Health and Safety Waiver.

"Shall the NYSPHSAA Transfer Appeal Guidelines include a financial hardship waiver."

"Shall new language be developed allowing a student to transfer within a **district** once without penalty in their high school career." Note: This would permit students to transfer from one high school to another within a multiple high school district.

"Shall competitors be allowed to use non-motorized push or pull carts during league, sectional or NYSPHSAA championship competition."

"Shall the minimum nights rest rule for a scrimmage and/or a contest be changed to 4 nights." NOTE: The minimum time between interschool football scrimmages is two nights; four nights for a contest.

IV. SECTION XI ACTION ITEMS**A. Tournament**1. Boys' and Girls' Tennis – Section XI Team Tournament

Motion: T. Mullins Second: G. McCarthy

To approve the following:

"Shall the following one-year experiment for the 2010-11 school year be made permanent:

Twenty-four teams may qualify; the top five teams in the upper-ability leagues and the first place team in the lower-ability leagues qualify. Matches will be played at the site of the higher seed. Home court for tie-breaking matches will be determined by the outcome of the second match played by the two tied teams during the regular season. Finals will be played at a neutral site. If the first place position is tied in the lower-ability league, there will be a playoff match to determine the team that qualifies for the tournament. If there is a tie for fifth place in the upper-ability league, the same policy applies. These matches MUST be played on the NEXT AVAILABLE DATE after the regular season."

2. Suffolk County Track Coaches' Association Winter Track Invitational – February 25, 2012

Motion: D. Ferry Second: R. Mayo

To approve the following:

"Shall the Suffolk County Track Coaches' Association be permitted to conduct an invitational winter track meet on February 25, 2012, at St. Anthony's High School."

Notes:

- This meet would be held after the Section XI championship on February 12, 2012, and prior to the NYSPHSAA championship on March 3, 2012.
- Section XI policy states, "All Section XI invitational meets or tournaments must be scheduled prior to the last regular scheduled contest by Section XI (effective winter 2003-04), i.e. not to be a culminating championship event of that season. Approval for such tournaments will be referred to the Tournament Committee if necessary. (Rev. 10/21/03)

a. Enrollment Criteria

"Shall Section XI utilize the State Education Department Student Information Reporting System (SIRS) as criteria for placement." (Example: January 2012 SIRS report will determine placement for all sports and conferences for the 2012-13 school year.)

b. Basic Conference Placement

“Shall the basic conference placement be determined by utilizing the rank order of Section XI member schools listed on the State Education Department Student Information Reporting System (SIRS) as follows:

- Conference I – 14 highest enrollment
- Conference II – 15 next highest enrollment
- Conference III – 16 next highest enrollment
- Conference IV – 16 next highest enrollment

2. Baseball Regular Season Suspended Game Rule

To approve the following:

“Shall the regular season suspended game rule be changed as follows: *If any game is suspended for any reason prior to it being an **official** game, that game must resume from the point of interruption according to the following:*

*Should the suspended game be the first game of a two-game series or the first or second game of a three-game series, play will resume on the date of the next scheduled game of the series, prior to the scheduled game, even if the game is on the opposite site from the original game **unless both schools agree to play on the next available date which is prior to the next scheduled game.** Should the suspended game be the final game of a series, play will resume at the same site on the next available date.*

V. NEW BUSINESS

1. Spectator Code of Conduct - Conference I Athletic Director, Pete Blieberg (Sachem), expressed concerns regarding sportsmanship standards during free throws at basketball contests. As stated in both the "Code of Conduct for Spectators" and the "Guidelines and Recommendations for Codes of Behavior for Coaches, Participants, Spectators and Administrators in Interscholastic Competition", spectators are to refrain from the "**stamping of feet**", along with taunting, foul and abusive language, inflammatory/ disrespectful remarks and behavior, and the use of noisemakers. Violations during a free throw attempt will be penalized by repeating the free throw, if missed. Conference I feels that noise should be tolerated during free throw attempts as long as it is not abusive. This item will be referred to the Section XI Sportsmanship Committee for discussion and possible recommendations to be considered by the Conferences and Athletic Council in March.
2. New Uniform Requirement - Bayport-Blue Point Athletic Director Tim Mullins, and Huntington Athletic Director Georgia McCarthy, asked Section XI representatives to the NYSPHSAA, Nick DeCillis and Lisa Lally, to request that Section XI member schools be granted a waiver of the requirement for schools to have new uniforms for a period of three years.
3. Admissions - Port Jefferson Athletic Director Debra Ferry led a discussion regarding Conference IV's request to have the Section XI Admissions Committee meet to discuss the possibility of allowing the Section to collect admissions at additional athletic events, specifically spring track. This item will be referred to the Section XI Admissions Committee.
4. Football Placement - Hampton Bays Athletic Director Drew Walker led a discussion regarding Conference IV's feeling regarding the rotation of the 12-team division in football. Conference IV feels that Division 4 should always have 12 teams, and Divisions 1-3 should have 14 teams. This is based on the enrollment discrepancy between larger and smaller schools within each division. President Mary Anne Jules has directed Drew Walker to attend the next Football Committee meeting to voice this concern.
5. State Championships - Discussion took place regarding Section XI's participation in state championships. Nick DeCillis will bring this item to the January 22, 2012 state association meeting.
