#### **Discussion Items:**

(D) 6th Graders Participation in Interscholastic Athletics–NYSED Regulation Section XI voted opposed - with initial discussion. It is split in the state 33% opposed, 33% in favor and 33% want to learn more of specifics and guidelines

(D) Female & Male Section Representatives

Conversation was about whether this means a male/female rep or a representative for male/female sports.

(D) Boys Lacrosse Game Rule #3 – "A one-arm swing with a Crosse whether contact is made or not, shall be considered a personal foul – slashing. This includes the over-the-head check." NYSPHSAA Handbook p.132

The removal of the one-handed check at the modified level.

(D) Wrestling Game Condition #6c – "With Section approval, a sudden victory overtime period shall be permitted in modified wrestling. Wrestlers must start in the

standing position or the referee's position, and the period shall not exceed 30 seconds. (May 2010)" NYSPHSAA Handbook p.140

Amend the NYSPHSAA Handbook language for Modified Wrestling to say "With Section approval, when the contestants are tied at the end of the three regular periods, they may wrestle overtime. Overtime will first consist of one 30 second sudden victory period in which the wrestlers will start in the neutral position, and if the score is still tied after this sudden victory overtime period wrestlers may use another 30-second ultimate ride out tiebreaker using the NFHS game rules for overtime"

- B. Policy** – The Policy Committee met on Monday, April 3, 2023 at 9 am in the Section XI office. In attendance: Chair R. Cox; Conference I: P. Friel, A. Amesti; Conference II: T. Horan, J. The Committee recommends approval of the following:

1. Independent Competitors for Boys and Girls Golf

**2. Travel Policy**

Section XI provides transportation and lodging for Regional and NYSPHSAA Championship competition to sites other than those on Long Island. The Executive Director arranges for all transportation and lodging. **To be eligible to compete, all athletes must use the transportation provided by**

**Section XI.** Clarification: On trips off of Long Island, if the athlete does not travel to the competition using transportation provided by Section XI, he/she will not be allowed to compete.

*A district who provides "district transportation", organized by the Athletic Director, may waive the Section XI transportation travel policy. This may only occur when attending a State Championship where an overnight stay is not provided by Section XI. When this occurs, the district assumes all responsibility for the athlete(s) before, during and after the State Championship tournament.*

The only exception to this rule is that an athlete may return home with his/her own parent(s) if the request is made in writing by the parent(s) utilizing the Section XI travel release form to the sport chairman (or the athletic director in the case of a team sport) **prior** to the athlete's departure from Suffolk County and provided the athlete is released at the competition site to his/her **own** parent(s).

**BUS TRANSPORTATION - For Individual Sports**

At the discretion of the sport chairman and the Executive Director, coaches MAY be invited to ride the bus without charge, provided space is available. There is no provision for alternates or athletes who have not qualified.

The sport chairman shall arrange for travel supervision as follows:

**The chairperson in conjunction with Section XI has the responsibility to ensure there is adequate supervision on the bus to the State Championship for all individual Sports.**

In gymnastics, swimming, tennis, wrestling, golf and bowling -  
1 supervisor in addition to the sport chairman.

In cross country, winter track and spring track - 4 supervisors in addition to the sport chairman.

Bus departure times and sites are determined by the sport chairman and the Executive Director.

**BUS TRANSPORTATION - For Team Sports**

Bus transportation will NOT BE PROVIDED for parents, extra athletes, coaches from other schools, or family members of athletes or coaches.

**Limitations on transportation for team sports are:**

- ~ Basketball and Volleyball = 16 maximum
- ~ Baseball, Field Hockey, Lacrosse, Soccer, and Softball = 23 maximum
- ~ Cheerleading: Large Squad = 36 maximum  
Small Squad = 23 maximum

These numbers reflect the TOTAL team party including coaches and supervisors.

In team sports each school shall provide its own supervision. Section XI will fund a maximum of two adults per team. (Additional supervisors that member schools wish to provide will be welcomed, providing there is room on the bus.)

Specific departure times will be determined by the team's athletic director in consultation with the Executive Director. Depending on the destination, teams which have a scheduled competition prior to 4PM will generally travel to the site the day before competing. Departure from the site is **immediately** following the conclusion of the competition or after a team loses in an elimination format. There will be no stops for practicing prior to arrival at the competition site. Unless prior approval is granted by Section XI. There will be no side trips or stopovers exclusive of the usual meal breaks.

**LODGING**

Athletes are housed four per room. Coaches are housed two per room.

Rooming lists must be provided to the Executive Director by the sport chairman for individual sports, and by the athletic director for team sports. IF additional rooms are available and IF travel space is available, the Executive Director will arrange lodging for athletes/coaches beyond the limitations set above, and schools will be billed accordingly.

**MEAL ALLOWANCES Effective** 2012-13 school year, Section XI will not supply meal stipends.

**HOTEL/MOTEL CHECKOUT**

**Individual Sports**

Athletes and coaches are to check out of the hotel prior to competing on the final day of competition. This will be at the direction of the sport chairman.

**Team Sports**

On the first day of competition, teams must check out of the hotel PRIOR to game time. If successful, they will check into the hotel again following the competition.

At no time should athletes/coaches remain in hotel rooms beyond the hotel's specified checkout time UNLESS specific arrangements have been made to do so by the Executive Director.

**ATHLETE BEHAVIOR/EXPECTATIONS**

1. There will be no use of any form of alcoholic beverages.
2. There will be no smoking, vaping OR tabaco product use permitted.
3. There will be no use of drugs in any form unless prescribed by a physician.
4. All curfews and bed checks will be adhered to as set by the supervisor or coach in charge.
5. When traveling with Section XI as part of the NYSPHSAA championship tournament student athletes must remain with their Section XI chaperone for the duration of the event. At no time, may a student athlete be permitted to be released to their parents or guardians unless it is to sign them out at the conclusion of tournament play utilizing the Section XI travel release form.

**PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS**

1. If a violation occurs prior to or during the competition, the athlete will not be allowed to compete or to continue to compete. Section XI will make a recommendation for disciplinary action.
2. If a violation occurs after the competition, Section XI will make a recommendation for disciplinary action.
3. If the situation becomes intolerable, the parents and school will be notified immediately and arrangements made to transport the athlete home.

C. Tournament – The Tournament Committee met on Tuesday, April 4, 2023 at 10 am in the Section XI office. In attendance: Chair D. Butler; Conference I: P. Friel, C. Agostino; Conference II: J. Mercado, J. Friesen; Conference III: B. Denniston, J. Sparacio; Conference IV: D. Phillips, A. Sherrard. Also in attendance: M. DeVincenzo, T. Gulluscio, K. Finnerty, T. Combs, P. Blieberg.

The Committee recommends approval of the following:

1. Boys and Girls Basketball:
  - Eliminate overall Sectional Championship games (large school vs small school)
  - Neutral site for AAA semifinal games
  
2. Boys Golf County Tournament Proposal:
  - Current 2022-23 Qualifying Procedures:**
    - Top 36 and ties from each conference tournament (4 conferences) qualified for the individual tournament
    - This past fall we had 144 golfers qualify for the tournament
    - Top 40 and ties moved onto the second round
  - With 144 golfers qualifying for day 1 of the championship, the bottom 44 golfers scored between 90-108 on day 1. The cut score for day 2 was ties at 82.
  - Proposal for 2023-2024 season and future:**
    - Top 24 golfers from each conference tournament qualify. Any ties for 24<sup>th</sup> place must be determined with a playoff hole(s) immediately following conference tournament (24 hard number).
    - 96 golfers in total from the 4 conferences qualify for the tournament.
    - Day 1 – 1 morning shotgun start with 24 groups, 6 holes can be doubled up.
    - Top 40 and ties qualify for Day 2
    - After Day 2 - Top 24 earn All-County and top 9 qualify for States (Same from the past)
  - Rational for the proposed changes:**
    - Day 1 will consist of one shotgun start instead of an AM and PM start. This will create level and fair playing conditions for all players. No more worrying about wet AM conditions vs. windy PM conditions, darkness, weather effecting one group and not the other, etc.
    - The start time has more flexibility with one shotgun start, so schools won't have to get a bus at 5-6am.
    - If there is rain in the morning, there would be more flexibility to delay vs. reschedule.
    - Field of players becomes more competitive and will promote better play by having the best golfers playing.
    - Event becomes more manageable to mark, score, etc., and coaches/players will have more time to plan and order buses to return for day 2.
  - Team championships – Bracket Tournament 24 teams (NO CHANGE)**
    - League champions from regular season will be seeded 1 – 8 and receive first round BYES.
    - The other 16 teams consist of the top four qualifying teams from each of the four conference tournaments. All 24 teams are placed into a slope/rating matrix where course rating, slope, strokes, and top 5 team average to calculate a ranking 1-24.
    - Matches up to the SEMIFINALS will be 9 hole matches at highest seed course or neutral site courses, following the same procedures as regular season matches between each team's top 6 golfers. SEMIFINALS and FINALS will be played at a neutral site on the same day. SEMIFINALS will be a 9 hole match in the morning, FINALS will be a 9 hole match following in the afternoon.

3. Wrestling - Increase the amount of places in the Division II Section XI Individual Wrestling Tournament from 4 to 6. The reason being is Section XI Teams are losing points for the NYSPHSAA Dual Championship Seed meeting and the at-large selection as other sections have 6 places individually that earns them points for all 6 place finishers from the previous year and we currently can only earn points for 4 place finishers.
