

2. Longwood JV9 Boys' Basketball Player Misconduct – The Executive Director and the Longwood Athletic Director provided information regarding the misconduct of Longwood JV9 Boys' Basketball player, Kyvon Anderson. A "Misconduct Report" was filed by Section XI official, Daniel Simpson. Mr. Simpson reported that Kyvon Anderson used vulgarity and pushed him with both hands in the upper torso during a JV9 basketball contest held on February 7, 2005, at Sachem East High School. The Executive Board determined that "probable cause" existed; therefore, a hearing of the Section XI Ethics Committee will be scheduled.
3. NYSPPHSAA Report – N. DeCillis and P. Nickerson reported on issues addressed at the January 28, 2005, meeting of the NYSPPHSAA Executive Committee:
 - N. DeCillis provided information on the NYSPPHSAA approval to waive the facemask requirement for the 2005 softball season.
 - N. DeCillis reviewed the request to use 3-man officiating in all state tournament contests in boys' basketball. This request was denied by the CAC and the NYSPPHSAA Executive Committee.
 - A discussion took place regarding Assemblyman Morelle's and Senator Libous proposed legislation (Assembly Bill A21262 and Senate Bill S2064). It is important that all of us involved in high school athletics voice our objection to this legislation in order to maintain control over the future of our association.
 - It was announced that Kevin Seaman has been selected as the new counsel of the NYSPPHSAA.
4. Accounting Firm – Finance Chairman M. Maina reviewed the process and timeline for the selection of a new accounting firm for Section XI. Mr. Maina announced that a "Request for Proposal for Professional Auditing Services" was mailed to five accounting firms on February 7, 2005. The due date for proposals is March 11, 2005. A committee will be established to review all proposals. The Executive Board will meet on April 4, 2005, at 4:00 pm, to select an accounting firm.
5. Counsel – K. Seaman reported on:
 - Stedronsky vs. Section XI, Small Claims Court – The 4th District Court dismissed the Stedronsky complaint on the basis of the "lack of jurisdiction".
 - Girls' Gymnastics Incident – A discussion took place regarding an individual who attempted to disrupt the NYSPPHSAA Girls' Gymnastics Championship meet by serving legal papers to two of the Section XI coaches.
6. NYSPPHSAA Hall of Fame – E. Cinelli announced that Catherine D. Gallagher has been accepted for induction into the NYSPPHSAA Hall of Fame. The ceremony will take place on Thursday, August 4, 2005, at the Hyatt Windwatch, Hauppauge, New York.
7. Goals and Objectives – E. Cinelli provided the Executive Board with a written report on the progress of this year's goals and objectives.
8. Section XI Financial Policies – E. Cinelli provided drafts of credit card policies, expense reimbursement procedures, and a petty cash policy. These items are being referred to the Section XI Policy Committee for action.
9. Web Advertising – E. Cinelli received two proposals for web advertising from instructional institutions. The Executive Board requested that a "Request for Proposal" be sent to organizations that offer coaching courses to ascertain whether they are interested in advertising during the 2005-06 school year.
10. Safety Conference – A discussion took place regarding the Wednesday, January 19, 2005, Section XI Safety Conference, "Life of an Athlete". This program was well

received. This Action-on-Target Program is part of a 5-year plan where a new aspect will be added each year.

11. SAT – President W. Shierant discussed with the Executive Board that the new SAT will be 30 to 40 minutes longer. This will impact the scheduling of varsity football games scheduled for the afternoon of the first Saturday in November. This item will be brought to the Conference meetings for discussion and possible remedy.
12. Bowling Incident – E. Cinelli provided information regarding the actions of six members of the Section XI Boys' Bowling All-Star team while at the NYSPHSAA Bowling Championship on March 5, 2005. It is alleged that these six individuals damaged the rooms in which they were staying at the Desmond Hotel in Albany. Executive Director E. Cinelli is investigating the incident.

B. NYSPHSAA Executive Committee – N. DeCillis, P. Nickerson
At its January 28, 2005 meeting, the NYSPHSAA Executive Committee effected the following:

1. Girls Cross Country - Approved the reappointment of Marbry Gansle as Girls Cross Country State Coordinator for a 5 year term.
2. Boys Volleyball - Approved the reappointment of Judy Hartmann as Boys Volleyball State Coordinator for a 5 year term.
3. Classification - Approved to accept as official the enrollment numbers presented for 2005-2006 Classification of Schools.
4. Non Public School Classification Committee - Approved a recommendation by the Non Public School Classification Committee for Sections to formulate a Classification Committee to review the classification of their non public school members to be implemented in the 2006-2007 school year. *In the evaluation process the following criteria must be included, but not limited to:*
 - *Periodic review – at least every two years*
 - *Sport specific – season specific*
 - *BEDS Numbers*
 - *Levels of competition – regular season*
 - *Level of success (5 year period)*
 - *League, Conference, Sectional, Regional, State*
 - *Approval by Athletic Council*
 - *Appeal process*
5. Boys Tennis Championships - Approved to allow the PSAL to participate in the 2005 Boys Tennis Championships on a one year trial basis.
6. Field Hockey - Approved in Field Hockey permanent adoption of Rule 2-1-2a *Officials may wear a solid color shirt contrasting with the color of both teams' uniform tops or alternating black and white 1-inch vertically striped shirt;* and Rule 4-2-2g: *The game clock may continue to run after goals are scored and when one team is ahead by 5 or more goals.*
7. Softball - Approved the waiver of the NOCSAE approved facemask requirement for the 2005 softball season.
FYI: Schools may permit the student athletes to wear batting helmets with attached face masks.

8. Winter Track - Approved a waiver for the reduction of contests from 6 to 5 in Winter Track for Section 11.
9. Membership - Approved as Associate Member: James E. Allen Alternative School (11).
10. Girls Tennis - Approved to accept the recommendation of the CAC to deny the request to fill the 2 byes in the state tournament opening round brackets in both singles and doubles competition in Girls Tennis.
11. Boys Basketball - Approved to accept the recommendation of the CAC to deny the request to use 3-man officiating in all state tournament contests in Boys Basketball.
12. Girls Basketball - Approved to accept the recommendation of the CAC the request to rotate the selection of the 12th official between the sections in Girls Basketball.
13. Wrestling - Approved to extend the two class state tournament format experiment in Wrestling to 2005-06.
14. Amateur Status - Approved the additional wording in #2 Amateur-NOTE, Page 55 in the NYSPHSAA Handbook.
NOTE: Only awards or prizes having a monetary value of one hundred dollars or less per competition will be approved by the Association-*move NOTE up to #2 and add the following sentence: When honoring student athletes for success in NYSPHSAA sponsored championship events, Boards of Education are encouraged to approve limited awards that are appropriate to high school level competition.*
15. Practice Sessions - Approved language for clarifying in the NYSPHSAA Handbook, adding as a second sentence on Page 68 under Practice Sessions, #22B- *Specifically, during the regular season physical and/or instructional activities related to the sport on seven consecutive days is prohibited*
16. Championship Philosophy Review Committee - Defeated the Championship Philosophy Review Committee's recommendation of the Outdoor Track/Field Committee's amendment proposal to *expand the definition of excellence for an individual sport to be one class for every 300 schools with a program to a maximum of three (3). (15 NO/7 YES) The votes were cast as follows: Section 1: 2 no; Section 2: 2 no; Section 3: 2 yes; Section 4: 1 yes/1 no; Section 5: 2 no; Section 6: 1 yes/1 no; Section 7: 2 no; Section 8: 2 no; Section 9: 2 yes; Section 10: 2 no; Section 11: 1 yes/1 no.*
17. Morelle Legislation - Executive Director Nina VanErk reported on the efforts of the Association to lobby against the proposed legislation of Assemblyman Joseph Morelle to change the way the NYSPHSAA qualifies student athletes for our state championships and to also change the voting process utilized by the NYSPHSAA. She stated we need to react in a proactive way to oppose this legislation and asked that each school district, i.e., Superintendent, Board of Education, Athletic Director, send a letter to Assemblyman Morelle.
18. Strategic Planning Committee - Executive Director Nina VanErk reported that the committee met on December 8, 2004, and came up with a draft for recommendations in legal and legislative initiatives, central office and staffing, technology, safety & risk management, marketing the Association and championships, sportsmanship initiatives, championship events, coaches and officials programs, insurance, governance and representation, communication, outside influences and budget and finance. She stated there were a number of items the

committee members needed to seek Section input on: coming up with a position statement requesting that the State Education Department eliminate the opting out option for physical education classes; see how Sections and their membership think about the Duration of Competition Regulation-is it fine as written or does it need changes since there has been an increase in graduation requirements at the high school level; and the need to advocate athletic trainers in all schools. She noted a more finalized draft for review by the Executive Committee will be available at the May meeting. She announced the next meeting of the committee is scheduled for Thursday, February 10, 2005, at 9:30AM in the NYSPHSAA office.

19. Site Selection Committee - Assistant Director Walter Eaton reported that the committee has reviewed the current process of selecting a tournament site and have explored the elements of what would be the appropriate set of guidelines and philosophies to select a championship site in each of our tournaments.
20. Retirement - Executive Director Nina VanErk thanked Ron Shaw for his years of service and assistance as the attorney for the Association and wished him a happy, healthy retirement. Mr. Shaw will be honored on August 3, 2005, at the Central Committee meeting on Long Island.

C. NYSPHSAA Executive Director – Nina VanErk

1. Classification of Non Public Schools – The following was approved by the Executive Committee (1-28-2004) for implementation in the 2006-07 school year. *As a 2-year experiment, Sections would be required to formulate a Classification Committee to review the classification of their non public school members. In the evaluation process the following criteria must be included, but not limited to:*
 - *Periodic review – at least every two years*
 - *Sport specific – season specific*
 - *BEDS Numbers*
 - *Levels of competition – regular season*
 - *Level of success (5-year period)*
 - *League, Conference, Sectional, Regional, State*
 - *Approval by Athletic Council*
 - *Appeal Process*

3. Hazing Workshops – Assistant Director Lloyd Mott has developed a workshop entitled, “Hazing: Identification and Prevention.” Leagues and Sections are encouraged to schedule a workshop for their member schools. For more information, contact Lloyd Mott.
4. Thunder Policy – At the October Executive Committee meeting, it was approved to amend the NYSPHSAA lightning policy to include thunder in the policy for all school-sponsored contests – local level (league and non-league) through State Championship play with a 30-minute wait to resume the competition. The NYSPHSAA Thunder and Lightning Policy (effective 10/25/04) now states: “1.) *Thunder and lightning necessitates that contests be suspended. The occurrence of thunder and/or lightning is not subject to interpretation or discussion – thunder is*

*thunder, lightning is lightning. *With your site administrator, set up a plan for shelter prior to the start of any contest. 2) When thunder is heard and/or lightning is seen, the following procedures should be adhered to: a.) Suspend play and direct participants to go to shelter, a building normally occupied by the public or, if a building is unavailable, participants should go inside a vehicle with a solid metal top (e.g. bus, van, car).; b.) Do not permit people to stand under or near a tree; and have all stay away from poles, antennas, towers and underground watering systems.; c.) After thunder and/or lightning have left the area, wait approximately **30 minutes** after the last boom is heard or strike seen before resuming play or competition.*

5. Assemblyman Morelle's Correspondence and Proposed Legislation – The Association is deeply concerned with Assemblyman Morelle's proposed legislation which was mailed to all Athletic Administrators. The Association would appreciate receiving a copy for our records of any correspondence that is sent to Assemblyman Morelle from a member school.

Our fundamental concern with the proposed legislation is the imposed impact that it would have on associations in general. As you are aware, the NYSPHSAA is a non-profit association of member schools. We currently have 1,587 member schools representing both public and non public institutions. During the past few years, we have attempted to encourage Mr. Morelle to allow the NYSPHSAA's Constitution and democratic process drive the procedure for change. Legislative driven change will reduce our ability to serve at the direction of our membership and will begin to deteriorate the ability of all associations to function in a proactive manner.

6. Softball Face Masks – At the January Executive Committee, it was approved to waive the NOCSAE approved face mask requirement for the 2005 season. Schools **MAY** permit the student athletes to wear batting helmets with attached face masks. This waiver was requested due to limited availability of NOCSAE approved facemasks and the late notification of the "NOCSAE approved" requirement. Schools should be prepared to outfit all softball teams with NOCSAE approved facemasks for the 2006 season.
7. Practice Rule Clarification – The following clarification will be added to the NYSPHSAA Handbook on page 68 Eligibility Standard #22-B and inserted as the second sentence.
- Specifically, during the regular season physical and/or instructional activities related to the sport on seven consecutive days is prohibited.*
8. Dues Increase – Reminder: The NYSPHSAA member dues for 2005-2006 will be increasing the base fee by \$50 (\$650) for the base fee and 5 cents per pupil (70 cents). The base fee covers the first 300 students in grades 7-12.
9. Classification Cut Off Numbers 2005-06 – Reminder: The five classification cut off numbers will change for next year. They are located in the NYSPHSAA Handbook on page 145. They will be:

11. Boys' Lacrosse Championship Finals – The site for the June 4, 2005 Finals has been moved to Cornell University (4) with housing for the teams available at Ithaca College.
12. NYSPPHSAA Counsel – Nina announced that Kevin Seaman has been selected as the new counsel of the NYSPPHSAA.
13. NYSPPHSAA Hall of Fame – Nina offered congratulations to Cathy Gallagher as she will be inducted into the NYSPPHSAA Hall of Fame. The ceremony will take place on August 4, 2005, at the Hyatt Windwatch, Hauppauge.

D. Counsel – Kevin Seaman

1. Morelle Legislation – Kevin Seaman offered his opinion on the Morelle legislation. He feels that this legislation is improper and could be illegal as the New York State Board of Regents delegated by law that the NYSPPHSAA and its Sections will govern interscholastic athletics in the State of New York.
2. Stedronsky Claim – Kevin Seaman reported that the 4th District Court dismissed the Stedronsky small claims complaint on the basis of lack of jurisdiction.
3. Longwood JV9 Boys' Basketball Player – Kevin Seaman reported that there will be an Ethics Committee hearing at 2pm on March 15, 2005, involving a Longwood JV9 Boys' Basketball player who pushed a basketball game official on February 7, 2005. This is the second time that the Ethics Committee met this winter regarding this type of misconduct where an official was pushed by an athlete.
