**II. NYSPHSAA Scholar-Athlete School of Distinction Presentation** – New York State Public High School Athletic Association Assistant Director, Walter Eaton, presented North Babylon administrators, High School Principal Donald Shevlin, and Athletic Director Matt Calarco, with the NYSPHSAA Scholar-Athlete School of Distinction Award. This award is presented to a school district that has received scholar-athlete recognition (90 or above average) for team members in each varsity sport during the 2005-06 school year. This is the second time that a school from Section XI has been recognized with this honor.

**III. REPORTS****A. EXECUTIVE BOARD**

The Board met on Tuesday, October 3, 2006, at 4:00 pm, at the Section XI Office. In attendance: President L. Lally, R. Goldin, C. Delargy, W. Shierant, M.A. Jules, N. DeCillis, P. Nickerson, A. Van Cott, J. Finello, L. Schwartz, K. Seaman, L. Light, H. Maloney (Items 1-2), D. Madison (Items 1-3), J. Sexton and E. Cinelli. (Absent: P. Ferenz).

1. President - Lisa Lally called the meeting to order at 4:10 pm, and introduced the members of the Executive Board.
2. Internal Claims Auditor Helen Maloney – Ms. Maloney reviewed her July 21, 2006, August 28, 2006, and September 22, 2006, memos to the Executive Board. She recommended to the Board that payments must be made from original documents, not faxes. She also recommended that copies be made of all checks received in the Section XI office. Discussion took place with respect to the distribution of meal stipends for state tournaments and procedures regarding the issuance of hotel checks for state championships and reimbursements for coordinators that attend New York State Public High School Athletic Association meetings.
3. Financial Items  
The Executive Board approved the following:
  - Upon the advice of the Internal Claims Auditor, faxes will no longer be considered acceptable documentation for payment.
  - The Executive Director shall attempt to contact the Internal Claims auditor before issuing checks for hotels and/or meals for NYSPHSAA Championships. However, if unable to do so, the Executive Director has been authorized to approve checks for hotels and/or meals for NYSPHSAA Championships in the event the Internal Claims Auditor is not available. All documentation for such checks shall subsequently be presented to the Internal Claims Auditor for review.
  - All NYSPHSAA Championship meal stipends for student-athletes and supervisors must be verified by obtaining signatures of all those receiving such stipends.
  - Authorized the Section XI President to approve payments in emergency situations when the Internal Claims Auditor is unavailable.
4. Appointments  
The Executive Board approved the following:
  - Sport Chairs for the 2006-07 school year.
  - Committee Chairs for the 2006-07 school year.
5. Finances
  - A. The Executive Board approved the following:
    - Staff-related items, including conference attendance authorization
    - Contractual items
    - Leasing/service agreement continuations
    - Declaration of identified equipment as obsolete
    - Revision of credit card policy to redefine the spending limit of \$5,000 per purchase with a credit line not to exceed \$10,000.
  - B. The Executive Director provided the Section XI Meal and Refreshment Quarterly Report for the period between May 23, 2006, and October 2, 2006.
  - C. The Executive Director provided a chart of tentative special events for 2006-07. Discussion took place with respect to the types of events that would be approved by the Executive Board for financial reimbursement.
  - D. The Executive Director provided a report of Section XI Petty Cash Fund expenditures for the period between May 23, 2006, and October 2, 2006.

6. Treasurer's Report – Larry Light

- A. The Treasurer indicated that a number of schools had not yet paid their 2006-07 Dues and Service Charges. He will contact these schools that have not made payment. If payment is not made by the deadline of October 15, 2006, these schools are no longer considered members of Section XI.
- B. The Treasurer reviewed the 2005-06 end-of-the-year budget. Details of this will be provided to the Executive Board at the January meeting once the financial statements have been received from Coughlin Foundotos Cullen & Danowski, LLP.
- C. The Executive Director provided information regarding the Management Letter. Final copies of the Management Letter will be provided to the Executive Board once it has been received from Coughlin Foundotos Cullen & Danowski, LLP.

7. NYSPPHSAA Reports

- A. Paula Nickerson reported on the August 9-11, 2006, Central Committee meeting, including the following:
  - The state has approved the penalty for cheating on the Hydration Test in wrestling. A wrestler caught cheating on the hydration test can no longer participate in wrestling from the point he is caught cheating for the remainder of the season.
  - The state has approved the Yellow Card Accumulation Policy in Soccer.
  - Items that will be discussed at the October NYSPPHSAA Executive Committee meeting.
- B. Lisa Lally informed the Executive Board that she and Ed Cinelli are both members of the NYSPPHSAA Structure and Policy Review Committee. The first meeting of that Committee will be Thursday, October 5, 2006, at the New York State office.

8. Counsel – Kevin Seaman

- A. Mr. Seaman informed the Executive Board that the State Division of Human Rights rejected the age discrimination claim of football official, Joseph Gaeta, and found "no probable cause" that the discrimination was foisted upon him by Section XI.
- B. Mr. Seaman provided the ruling by The Honorable Peter Fox Cohalan regarding the Brian Carey lawsuit, indicating, "...*Finally, the Court declines to intrude on internal policies and determinations made by basketball officials and NYSPPHSAA with regard to cited misconduct and behavior on the basketball court except in the most egregious cases not readily apparent in this case...Accordingly, the petitioner's motion for injunctive relief is denied in its entirety...*" Mr. Seaman felt that this decision could be used in the future when the Section is challenged when issuing a misconduct.
- C. Discussion took place with respect to a draft of a 2007-10 Executive Director contract. A committee was established to discuss the contract proposal and make recommendations to the Executive Board at its January meeting.

9. Executive Board Relocation Subcommittee – Ross Goldin provided information regarding the July 21, 2006, viewing of possible properties that would be considered to house the Section XI office. The Committee will schedule a meeting in the near future to discuss the possibility of purchasing a building to house the Section XI office.10. Goals and Objectives – The Executive Director presented his Goals and Objectives for the 2006-07 school year.11. NYSPPHSAA Hall of Fame Nominations – The Executive Director provided information regarding the NYSPPHSAA Hall of Fame. The Executive Board approved the recommendation of the Executive Director to endorse possible candidates Jack Foley,

Three Village Administrator; Thad Mularz, Smithtown Administrator; and Mitch Kupchak, Brentwood Athlete.

12. Newsday High School Sports Message Board Chat Room – The Executive Director provided information regarding the Newsday chat room. There was a feeling that this chat room will create problems for school districts with respect to spectator conduct as a result of messages being placed on the message board. This website is run by Bill Eichenberger at Newsday.
13. Our Lady of the Hamptons Regional School – The Executive Director provided information regarding an Application for NYSPHSAA Membership that was received from Our Lady of the Hamptons Regional School. The Executive Director has spoken to Athletic Director Bernard Ryan, who has agreed that it would be inappropriate for Our Lady of the Hamptons Regional School to be a member of Section XI.
14. James E. Allen Alternative School – The Executive Director provided a copy of a July 14, 2006, letter received from Western Suffolk BOCES, indicating that they are canceling their Section XI membership for 2006-07.
15. NYSPHSAA Action Items – The Executive Director provided information regarding action items for the NYSPHSAA October meeting involving wrestling and spring track and field. These items will be discussed at the upcoming Conference and Council meetings.
16. Extension of Eligibility Request – The Executive Director provided correspondence with respect to an Extension of Eligibility request for Michael Davis from Bishop McGann-Mercy High School, which was denied at the August 31, 2006, Eligibility Committee meeting. Bishop McGann-Mercy High School did not file their request for an appeal within the appropriate timeframe. Therefore, no appeal was heard.
17. High School Sports Television – The Executive Director provided information regarding HSSTV and their interest in broadcasting Section XI boys' and girls' lacrosse contests.
18. Newsday and New York Times Articles – The Executive Director provided copies of articles from these publications dealing with "running up the score."
19. NYSPHSAA Scholar/Athlete Team School of Distinction – The Executive Director provided correspondence from NYSPHSAA Assistant Director, Walter Eaton, regarding the naming of North Babylon High School as a 2005-06 Scholar/Athlete Team School of Distinction. Representatives from North Babylon High School will be presented an award for this achievement at the October 17, 2006, Athletic Council meeting.
20. New Athletic Directors/Sport Chairs/Secretaries – The Executive Director provided listings of new Section XI Athletic Directors, Sport Chairs and Athletic Secretaries for 2006-07.
21. NYSAISAA – A list was provided of independent schools that are recognized by the NYSAISAA.
22. Future Dates/Sites for NYSPHSAA Championships – A chart was provided that indicated the dates/sites of the future NYSPHSAA Championships.

23. 2005-06 Boys' Lacrosse State Championship – The Executive Director provided a note received from NYSPHSAA Assistant Director, Walter Eaton, congratulating the Section for doing an outstanding job hosting the 2005-06 Boys' Lacrosse State Championship at Stony Brook University.
  24. Newspaper Articles – The Executive Director provided copies of various articles for informational purposes.
- B. NYSPHSAA CENTRAL COMMITTEE – N. DeCillis, P. Nickerson, P. Ferenz, A. Van Cott  
At its annual meeting of August 9-11, 2006, at the Holiday Inn, Grand Island, the NYSPHSAA Central Committee effected the following:
1. Sport Seasons - Approved the 2006-2007 Section Sports Seasons.
  2. Softball - Approved the reappointment of Cathy Allen as Softball State Coordinator for a 5-year term effective September 1, 2006.
  3. School of Distinction Award – Approved an amendment of the application standard for the School of Distinction award. *“Member schools sponsoring a varsity team with less than 5 athletes may apply for the School of Distinction Award and meet the 100% standard provided each athlete has a GPA of 90% or greater earned during their sports season.”*
  4. Wrestling
    - Approved the penalty for cheating on the Hydration Test in Wrestling. A wrestler caught cheating on the hydration test can no longer participate in wrestling from the point he is caught cheating for the remainder of the season.
    - Approved the continuation of a 2-division Wrestling State Championship effective 2006-2007.
  5. Yellow Card Accumulation Policy - Approved the following Yellow Card Accumulation Policy in Soccer:

*It is the intention of the NYSPHSAA Sportsmanship Committee to address the issue of the accumulation of Yellow Cards during the soccer season by an individual player. The situations surrounding Red Cards are dealt with directly under the NYSPHSAA Guidelines for Sportsmanship and Misconduct outlined in the State Handbook for all sports. The consequences for the accumulation of excessive Yellow Cards will be as follows:*

    - 1. Five Yellow Cards accumulated by a single player in the regular season will result in a one game suspension. Disqualifications due to an accumulation of five yellow cards occurring in the last game of the season will carry over into the next season of participation, if the team does not enter post season play.*
    - 2. The continued accumulation of Yellow Cards by the same individual will result in a one game suspension per additional Yellow Card.*
    - 3. In the event that the player receives two Yellow Cards in the same game, resulting in a Red Card, the two Yellow Cards will not count toward the season total, since the player will receive a one game suspension as a result of the misconduct and ejection.*
    - 4. The accumulation card total is for regular season play only and the process will start over again for post season play. However, any penalties awarded as a result of the last regular season game will carry over into the post season.*

*5. The post season policy will provide a one game suspension after three Yellow Cards and a one game suspension for each additional card received through the State Final. A one game suspension resulting from a yellow card in a team's last post season game will carry over into the next season of participation.*

*6. The coaches of both schools are to report all Yellow Cards to their League and Section by means of Mail, E-mail or Fax for tabulation. The officials should report to their boards concerning games in which cards are given and the reasons for issuance of the card. Board policy will determine the method of notification to the League and Section. A final end of the year report including data on disqualifications shall be sent to the NYSPHSAA Sportsmanship Coordinator.*

*7. Refusing to report or failing to report infractions and allowing players to continue play under these circumstances will result in the forfeiture of all games in which the individual in question participated.*

6. Boys Basketball – Approved the revised Class B brackets in Boys Basketball effective 2006-07.
7. Regional Brackets - Approved the revised Class B Regional brackets in 5-Class team sports if requested one season in advance.
8. Girls Lacrosse – Approved the continuation of 3 classifications for the Girls Lacrosse State tournament with a variation in classification effective 2006-2007. The classifications are: Class A – 1134-up; Class B – 750-1133; Class C – 749-below.
9. Boys Soccer - Approved the continuation of 5 classifications in the Boys Soccer State tournaments effective 2006-2007.
10. Boys Swimming/Diving – Approved the revised qualifying standards in the 200 Medley Relay, 200 Freestyle Relay, 200 Freestyle, 100 Freestyle, and the 500 Freestyle in Boys Swimming/Diving.
11. Committee Name Change - Approved to change the logo and name of the Action on Target Committee to Life of an Athlete Committee.

C. NYSPHSAA – Assistant Director, Walter Eaton

Mr. Eaton reviewed several items from the NYSPHSAA October 2006 Office Report:

1. Transfer Language – Proposed changes to the transfer rule will be voted on at the NYSPHSAA October meeting. Mr. Eaton stated that individual legislators are questioning the New York State Transfer Rule. Questions regarding consistency of application of the Transfer Rule are common.
2. Structure and Policy Review Committee – Mr. Eaton provided information regarding the NYSPHSAA Structure and Policy Review Committee. The first meeting took place on October 5, 2006, and is charged with the review of all aspects of the NYSPHSAA. Section XI President Lisa Lally and Executive Director Ed Cinelli are members of this Committee. The next meeting will be on November 29, 2006.
3. Field Hockey Championship – The NYSPHSAA Field Hockey championship will take place on November 17 and 18, 2006, at the Alliance Bank Stadium in Section III, as originally scheduled.

4. NYSPPHSAA Hall of Fame – Mr. Eaton reviewed the induction procedures for the NYSPPHSAA Hall of Fame. The deadline for receipt of nominations is December 15, 2006.

**EXECUTIVE BOARD MINUTES**

October 17, 2006

The Board met on Tuesday, October 17, 2006, at 10:30 am, at the Section XI Office. In attendance: President L. Lally, R. Goldin, C. Delargy, W. Shierant, M.A. Jules, N. DeCillis, P. Nickerson, A. Van Cott, L. Schwartz, K. Seaman, L. Light, and E. Cinelli. (Absent: J. Finello).

1. President - Lisa Lally called the meeting to order at 10:30 am.
2. New York State Department of Labor – The Executive Director provided a copy of correspondence from the New York State Department of Labor requesting information for the period July 1, 2005, through January 31, 2006. The Department of Labor has requested an appointment to examine payroll records. Kevin Seaman and Ed Cinelli will contact the Department of Labor to determine the reason for the investigation.
3. Fingerprinting – The Executive Director received a telephone call from Bart Zabin from the New York State Department of Education on Friday, October 13, 2006, regarding the private access system that allows school districts to obtain fingerprint clearance information on sports officials. At this time, Section XI does not have the ability to access this system. Mr. Zabin asked that Section XI request access by contacting the State Education Department's Senior Attorney, Deborah Marriott. Mr. Seaman stated that he will make this contact.
4. Our Savior New American – The Executive Director stated that a basketball coach from Our Savior New American contacted him regarding receiving New York State Public High School Athletic Association "Friend and Neighbor" status, which would allow Our Savior New American to participate against high schools throughout the country. The Executive Director informed this coach that Our Savior New American should apply for membership in the NYSAISAA. This group consists of independent schools in the state of New York that follow the rules and regulations of its association, and may play New York State schools as well as member schools of other state associations.
5. Payments to Schools Hosting Section XI Events - The Executive Director discussed procedures for paying schools that host Section XI playoffs. Examples would include the payment of facility use fees, timers, school security personnel, announcers, athletic trainers, scorekeepers, and custodial and grounds personnel. The Executive Board is requesting that a procedure be developed requiring that specific Section XI timesheets be used and verified by school administrators prior to being submitted to the Section for payment.
