PERTINENT INFORMATION

Qualifying for Tournament: The schools in Section XI are classified by school size and power rated. The top 12 schools in Division I, the top 10 in Division II and any team that has a .500 or better record in Division III qualify for post season.

Tournament Seeding: Seeding is determined by the final power ranking of the teams in Division I and Division II.

Higher Seed: During the course of the playoffs the higher seed is the home team. The higher seed will wear the home jersey.

Arrival of teams: Teams are instructed to report to the site director (host AD) upon arrival. It would be helpful if the visiting teams could contact the site regarding approximate arrival time.

Respect of Property: Coaches and Athletic Directors are urged to impress upon players and spectators the necessity of respecting the property of schools that are hosting the tournament games. Spectators must respect the Section XI Code of Conduct.

Programs: Each host school should present a numerical roster for each game.

Official Scorer: Each team is responsible for providing an official scorer, preferably an adult if available.

Timer: Timers are the responsibility of the host school when played at the site of the higher seed. It is expected that a visible clock and scoreboard be at the site.

Game Balls: Each team will provide 12 game balls for contests at neutral sites; the host school will provide game balls for contests at their school

Protest Committee: The Sports Chairperson or the Site Director (host AD) shall appoint a protest committee consisting of three people. A protest in any game must be lodged immediately, as prescribed in the Section XI rules with the official scorer and the protest must be settled at the time the protest is lodged. Play will not continue until the problem is solved.

Supervision: Each competing school is required to provide adequate supervision for students and fans of the team attending the game. Supervisors should present themselves upon arrival to the site chairman and assist with active supervision of the games.

Parking: Visiting schools should make every effort to communicate with the host school regarding parking. The host school should have parking areas clearly marked.

Rosters and Introductions: Each team will provide the chairperson with an up to date roster. The starting 10 players will be introduced at the County Championship game.

Programs: Programs will be available at the Finals. Each participating coach or athletic director is responsible for sending his school roster to the Sport Chairman

Ticket Prices: Admission is charged for the Semi – finals and Finals only.

Gate List (s): For all post season contests that require an admission fee, all participating schools shall be required to submit a gate list to the person in charge of admission. This list shall be limited to 12 and includes, supervisors, administrators, Board of Education members, school press and school photographers.

CONTEST INTERRUPTION

1. Whenever weather or other conditions cause the official(s) to interrupt a contest, the official(s) shall make every reasonable effort to resume and complete the contest, with full consideration of the weather and site conditions (as they affect safety and playing conditions). The official(s) shall wait a minimum of 30 minutes from the time of the interruption before considering the cessation of play.
2. When thunder is identified at the site of an outdoor contest, the official(s) will suspend play immediately and wait a minimum of 30 minutes from the time of the interruption before considering the cessation of play. The official(s) will then make a decision whether to cease play for that day or resume the contest.
3. If lightning is observed at the site of an outdoor contest by the official(s) 15 or fewer minutes prior to the scheduled start of that contest, the official(s) and the responsible school authorities shall not permit that contest to be played on that date.
4. If lightning is observed at the site of an outdoor contest by the official(s) during the playing of the contest, the official(s) shall immediately cease play for the day. The rules of the particular sport shall determine whether the contest is "official" or must be resumed at a later date.

NYSPHSAA THUNDER AND LIGHTNING POLICY - approved 3/14/06

The following policy will be in effect during Section championships and state qualifiers under the direction of the Executive Director, Sports Chair or designee:

1. Thunder and lightning necessitates that contests be suspended. The occurrence of thunder and/or lightning is not subject to interpretation - thunder is thunder, lightning is lightning.

* With your site administrator, set up a plan for shelter prior to the start of any contest.

2. When thunder is heard and/or when lightning is seen, the following procedures should be adhered to:

- a. Suspend play and direct participants to go to shelter, a building normally occupied by the public or if a building is unavailable, participants should go inside a vehicle with a solid metal top (e.g. bus, van, car).

- b. Do not permit people to stand under or near a tree; and have all stay away from poles, antennas, towers and underground watering systems.

- c. After thunder and/or lightning have left the area, wait **30 minutes** after the last boom is heard or strike is seen before resuming play or competition. (Revised 10/20/08 NYSPHSAA Executive Committee Meeting)
